Notes to the Reader:

The financial statements of the District have been prepared in accordance with the criteria established by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board ("GASB"), which is the source of authoritative accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"), as applied to governmental entities. The District's financial statements are prepared using the modified accrual basis of accounting. The financial statements include the following departures from GAAP:

- Management's discussion and analysis and substantially all disclosures required are omitted.
- The statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances – governmental funds has been omitted.

The financial forecasts present, to the best of management's knowledge and belief, the District's expected results of operations and cash flows for the forecast periods. Accordingly, the forecasts reflects its judgment as of May 17, 2025, the date these forecasts were prepared, of the expected conditions and its expected course of action. The assumptions disclosed herein are those that management believes are significant to the forecasts. There will usually be differences between the forecast and actual results, because events and circumstances frequently do not occur as expected, and those differences may be material.

The financial statements are developed by the District to comply with GAAP, although there may be departures from GAAP not identified. These statements are primarily intended for use in managing the District's operations and may not be suitable for other purposes. Users should be aware of these limitations when utilizing the financial statements.

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ASSUMPTIONS**

Services Provided

On October 17, 2024, the City Council of the City of St. George, Utah (the City), acting in its capacity as the creating authority for Tech Ridge Public Infrastructure District (the District) adopted a resolution creating the District. The Office of the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Utah issued a Certificate of Creation for the District on December 9, 2024, which was recorded in the real property records of the Utah County Recorder on February 7, 2025.

The District was established to provide financing for infrastructure improvements to facilitate development within the boundaries of the District. The District has the power to issue bonds for the purpose of paying all or part of the costs of acquiring, acquiring an interest in, improving, or extending certain public improvements, facilities, or property.

The District has no employees, and all administrative functions are contracted.

The District prepares its budget on the modified accrual basis of accounting using its best estimates as of the date of the budget hearing. These estimates are based on expected conditions and its expected course of actions. The assumptions disclosed herein are those that the District believes are significant to the budget. There will usually be differences between the budget and actual results because events and circumstances frequently do not occur as expected, and those differences may be material.

Revenues

Interest Income

Interest earned on the District's available funds has been estimated based on an average interest rate of approximately 3.5%.

Tax Increment Revenues

The Bonds are partially secured by tax increment revenues pursuant to the Participation Agreement between the District and the St. George Neighborhood Redevelopment Agency. The tax increment revenues is the difference between the amount of property tax revenues generated by the taxing entities within the Tech Ridge Community Development Project Area using the current taxable value and the amount of property taxes that would be generated from the same are using the bas taxable value.

Expenditures

Administrative Expenditures

Administrative and operations expenditures include the estimated services necessary to maintain the District's administrative viability such as legal, accounting, district management, insurance, and other administrative expenses.

Expenditures (continued)

Capital Outlay

The District anticipates infrastructure improvements as noted in the Capital Projects fund.

Debt Service

Interest payments are provided based on the schedule of debt service requirements to maturity for the anticipated Series 2025 Bonds (discussed under debt and leases).

Debt and Leases

Series 2025 Special Assessment Revenue Bonds

The District issued Special Assessment and Tax Increment Bonds, Series 2025 on June 18, 2025 in the par amount of \$48,990,000. The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds will be used by the District to (a) finance or reimburse a portion of the costs of acquiring, constructing, and/or installing certain Public Improvements to benefit the Assessment Area, (b) fund Debt Service Reserve Fund requirement, (c) fund a portion of the interest to accrue on the Series 2025 Bonds, and (d) to pay costs of issuance associated with the Series 2025 Bonds.

The Series 2025 Bonds bear interest of 6.250% payable semi-annually to the extent of pledged revenue available December 1, beginning on December 1, 2030. The bonds mature on December 1, 2054. The Bonds are subject to redemption prior to maturity on June 1, 2030.

Reserves

Debt Service Reserves

The District holds a Reserve Fund for its Series 2025 Bonds.
