Information on slides about current data availability in each system. Recording 26:55 See slides.</p> <p>HB 190 Employer tax credit added in legislative session. HB 290 non-refundable tax credit for \$1000 to children under 6 change to income phase out. HB379 Food preparation amendment, child cares exempted from food service establishment rules in certain situations. Requires Child Care Licensing and OCC to make regulations. SB12 Office of Child Care Advisory Council extended for another 3 years Education Savings Incentive: state funded \$300 match to my529 account for families experiencing IGP. After this year, this program will no longer be funded. Very low participation. CCDF reduced discretionary fund allocation. Office of Child Care budget update: Reduced federal discretionary budget by about \$21 million 2024-25, reducing the same this year. Draft proposal to reduce budget in areas that were unspent, returning to pre-COVID funding levels, trying to limit impact on families. Contracted partners also worked with OCC to adjust budgets as well. First budget reduction details available on public meetings website for Office of Child Care Advisory Council. Changes that impact families and providers will be phased in as families re-qualify for the program. One reduction is adjusting the number of application fees paid for the child by</p>
