**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TAYLORSVILLE DECLARING CERTAIN
PROPERTY AS SURPLUS PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, the Taylorsville City Council (the “Council”) met in regular session on May 6, 2026 to consider, among other things, declaring certain property as surplus property; and

WHEREAS, UTAH CODE ANN. §10-8-2 grants municipalities the power to “purchase, receive, hold, sell, lease, convey, and dispose of real and personal property for the benefit of the municipality;” and

WHEREAS, TAYLORSVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE §2.32.150 governs the disposal of surplus property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to TAYLORSVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE §2.32.150, the City desires to declare certain property, identified in Exhibit “A” and incorporated herein by this reference, as surplus; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that the above-stated property is not needed by the City, and it is therefore in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Taylorsville to declare the above-stated property as surplus.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Taylorsville City Council hereby declares as follows:

1. Declaration of Surplus Property. The Taylorsville City Council hereby declares that the property identified in Exhibit “A” is surplus property that is not needed by the City.

2. Authorization to Sell. The Mayor is hereby authorized to sell the above-declared surplus property based on the highest and best economic return to the City pursuant to TAYLORSVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE §2.32.150.

3. Minimum Bid. The Taylorsville City Council hereby approves the following methods to determine the highest and best economic return to the City: 1) competitive bid; 2) evaluation by a qualified and disinterested appraiser; 3) other professional publication and valuation service; or 4) an informal market survey by the City in the case of items of personal property possessing readily discernable market value. The Taylorsville City Council further hereby establishes that the minimum bid for the vehicles shall be no less than \$10,000 each.
