The Payson City Forebay Committee preserves our unique identity as, The Gateway to the Nebo Loop and Home to Adventure. The Forebay Area is a cultural commons where a deep-rooted love for the outdoors is passed down through generations. We protect the mountain-to-valley lifestyle that defines our heritage, ensuring the tradition of recreating in our own backyard remains a vibrant part of Payson's culture.
Describe how the requested PARC funds will be used.	Item 1: The Main Trailhead Kiosk 13,500\$ Funding will be used to create a kiosk at the main trailhead. This will serve as a central hub for safety and education. It will feature updated trail maps with distance and difficulty ratings to improve navigation. The kiosk will highlight local flora and points of interest. It also provides a vital space for posting community updates. This will help residents recreate responsibly. Item 2: Signs and Map Printing \$1000 Funding will be used to print items for the kiosk, library, update weathered signage, repair broken markers, and install clear boundary signs at entry points. These improvements will ensure visitor safety, provide accurate navigation, and prevent accidental trespassing on adjacent private property. Item 3: Trail Counter 3,500 (Lowest on Priority) A trail counter will provide accurate usage data to guide maintenance and prove community impact for future PARC grants. This data helps us manage resources effectively and demonstrate the growing recreational needs of Payson residents.,
Describe how your organization is funded.	Payson City Forebay Recreation Area is primarily funded through Payson City. These funds are supplemented by PARC grants and state recreation grants. We also partner with conservation volunteer groups to maintain and manage the trails.
