Broadening our demographic, Payson Community Theatre is now producing three productions annually providing family-friendly theatre experiences to all residents of Payson and surrounding communities. This gives an opportunity for South Utah Valley residents to participate as cast and/or crew members in a non-educational/professional theatre environment. An established tradition of Onion Days, many current and past residents of Payson attend the annual fall musical over the Labor Day weekend. This inspires younger patrons to gain respect and interest for the Fine Arts as well as more mature patrons an opportunity to support and enrich their love of theatre. Payson maintains a rich history and high-quality level amongst Utah community theatre. Continuing from last year PCT produced 3 productions including a musical revue, straight play, and the classic musical during Onion Days. This has enabled all ages as well as increase production crew opportunities for community members to participate.

Describe how the

will be used.

Payson Community Theatre is now producing 3 shows in a calendar year. Every production requires specific costumes, props, tech equipment and set materials. As production costs continue to increase, PARC funds allow PCT to keep ticket costs affordable to the general public. Funds will be used as follows;

PCT has secured the rights to produce Disney's FROZEN as

our show associated with the Onion Days Festival 2026. At just over \$17,000, the royalty rights are substantially higher than any other show PCT has ever produced. Our royalties are a large portion of our operational expenses and are asking for part of the Frozen royalties to be covered by the 2026-27 PARC tax grant.

* \$10,000 of PARC funds to go towards the rights for Frozen.

Payson Community Theatre receives funds from box office sales, concessions, and program sponsorships acquired from each season's productions. The 2025 season included A Night on Broadway Stories, Disney' Newsies and Ebenezer a Christmas Carol. We are gratefully funded by the PARC tax and our Onion Days theater grant from Payson City. All board members are volunteers and do not receive a salary.
