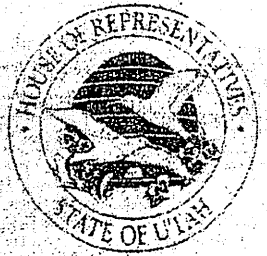

OFFICIAL CITATION RECOGNIZING

International Society Daughters of Utah Pioneers

The Utah Legislature honors the International Society Daughters of Utah Pioneers on its 125th anniversary, celebrated April 11, 2025, and recognizes its longstanding dedication to preserving Utah's pioneer history and heritage.

Founded on April 11, 1901, under the leadership of Annie Taylor Hyde, the daughter of pioneer and prophet John Taylor, the Society was established to ensure that the sacrifices, faith, and contributions of Utah's pioneers would be remembered and honored. Since its founding, the organization has remained committed to perpetuating the names and achievements of early settlers, preserving historic landmarks, and safeguarding artifacts and records that document Utah's beginnings.

Over the past 125 years, the Society has assembled an extensive historical collection, including more than 120,000 pioneer histories, over 40,000 photographs and paintings, tens of thousands of artifacts, and thousands of books. These materials are preserved through more than 120 museums and over 600 historical markers located across the United States and in eleven countries.

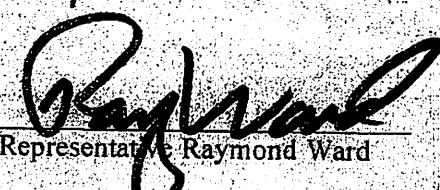
Through educational programming, published lesson materials and regular historical study, the Society continues to engage members and communities in meaningful preservation efforts. Since its founding, more than 101,000 women have been members, with over 21,000 active members today.
