21 1. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS  
22

23 Ryan Oakes, Chair, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.  
24

25 2. PUBLIC COMMENT  
26

27 There were no public comments.  
28

29 3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES  
30

31 The Trails and Active Transportation Committee meeting minutes of March 10, 2026 were  
32 reviewed and approved as amended.  
33

34 **Committee Member Poulter moved to approve the minutes of March 10, 2026. Committee**  
35 **Member Huebner seconded the motion. The motion was approved by Committee Members**  
36 **Crowther, Huebner, Oakes, Poulter, and Wirthlin.**  
37

38 4. STAFF UPDATES

39  
40 Ali Avery provided an update on the Trails Master Plan with community engagement at the  
41 Arbor Day event on April 25<sup>th</sup>. She continued that the community engagement period would  
42 open April 25<sup>th</sup> and extend through to the Kite Festival on May 16<sup>th</sup>. She added that the initial  
43 survey would be open and promoted at Arbor Day, the May trail cleanup on May 9<sup>th</sup>, the Golden  
44 Spoke event on May 16<sup>th</sup>, and the Kite Festival on May 16<sup>th</sup>. She noted there would be a second  
45 round of community engagement with the consultant recommendations from June 26<sup>th</sup> to July  
46 17<sup>th</sup> during the Liberty Fest events.

48 Ms. Avery requested Committee volunteers to promote the survey at upcoming City events:

57 The Committee discussed whether to promote the survey at the auto show and the Liberty Fest  
58 fireworks and how that would be accomplished. Ali Avery also suggested having the flyers with  
59 the QR code to the survey at the trailheads.

60  
61 Ali Avery spoke on the review periods for the survey:

- 63 • Recommendations June 1<sup>st</sup>-June 12<sup>th</sup>

69 Ali Avery reported on the City's General Plan update with a draft under review by staff. She  
70 shared a future land use map showing residential, mixed use corridor, business park, river  
71 oriented commercial and recreation, heavy industrial, light industrial, natural open space, parks  
72 & recreation, Legacy Nature Preserve, and districts. She noted these districts included Town  
73 Center, Village District, Regional Center, and Neighborhood Center. She added that the plan also  
74 included community and neighborhood greenways.

75

76 Ms. Avery also showed a map from the consultant with potential active transportation including  
77 major multi use pathways (high separation), separated multi use pathway/protected bike lanes  
78 (high separation), minor multi-use trails (high separation), standard or buffered bike  
79 lane/sidewalk (moderate separation), and shared lanes/sidewalk (less separation). She also  
80 mentioned that the Plan included goals for proposed trails and improvements for existing trails.  
81 She said after staff had reviewed the applicable sections they would bring the Plan to the Trails  
82 and Active Transportation Committee to review.

83  
84 Ali Avery provided an update on the Wild Rose to BST Connector and a presidential executive  
85 order that was dismantling regional offices for the Forest Service. She was unsure how this may  
86 impact the Trails Master Plan and plan for the connector. She also spoke on a maintenance  
87 agreement with Davis County and Salt Lake County and anticipated maintenance may have to be  
88 done by the City until the Salt Lake connection was made.

89  
90 Ali Avery noted that staff updated the City Council on the South Davis Greenway Feasibility  
91 Study on April 7<sup>th</sup>. She said there was a steering committee on April 15<sup>th</sup> to discuss funding,  
92 maintenance, and the final alignment. She showed images of what it may look like, the proposed  
93 final alignment, and the cross section. She presented the potential alignment which would run on  
94 the west side of Orchard Drive to Center Street and would then cross to the east side until  
95 Bountiful. Ms. Avery reviewed the trade-offs or considerations in implementing the South Davis  
96 Greenway including:

98       • Loss of on street parking  
99       • Landscape  
100           ○ Focused nodes  
101           ○ Vegetation/plantings  
102           ○ No turf per ordinance  
103       • Irrigation approaches  
104           ○ Separate system  
105           ○ Tied into adjacent property  
106       • Maintenance responsibility  
107       • Mail and package delivery  
108       • Garbage pickup/bus stops

110 Ali Avery noted that the State legislature had recently required no parking in bike lanes and how  
111 there were currently bike lanes on both sides of Orchard Drive. She mentioned that per City  
112 ordinance turf was not currently allowed in the park strip area which meant the focus was on  
113 determining whether to have drought tolerant landscaping, street trees, or rocks in this section.

115 Pedro Huebner mentioned that two unrelated residents had asked about the Greenway during the  
116 trail cleanup. He said it was positive feedback and a request for more information. Ali Avery  
117 commented that there was some signage about the Greenway at the community garden, rec  
118 center, on social media, and to residents along the route.

119  
120 Ali Avery shared that staff had a walk through today with the State for maintenance of the Wild  
121 Rose Trail. She added that this included curves to be re-sloped, drainage, clear vegetation and  
122 redefine trail (Checker Loop), and other maintenance.

123  
124 5. COMMITTEE MEMBER DISCUSSION ITEMS

125  
126 Ryan Oakes spoke on the priority locations for the bike racks including: City Hall, Legacy Park,  
127 Eaglewood Events Center, Porter's Landing Boat Takeout, Fox Hollow Park, Foxboro Wetlands  
128 Park, and Legacy Trail.

129  
130 The Committee reviewed and determined that the goal would be to install two bike racks per  
131 year and ranked the following in order of top priority:

- 132  
133 1) City Hall  
134 2) Legacy Park  
135 3) Eaglewood Golf Course  
136 4) Porter's Landing

137  
138 **Committee Member Huebner moved to approve bike racks at City Hall and Legacy Park**  
139 **in year one and Eaglewood Golf Course and Porter's Landing in year two. Committee**  
140 **Member Wirthlin seconded the motion. The motion was approved by Committee Members**  
141 **Crowther, Huebner, Oakes, Poulter, and Wirthlin.**

142  
143 Peter Wirthlin reported on the Adopt a trail/trail boss implementation plan and said he was  
144 waiting to hear back from Tyler Fonarow with the Salt Lake City stewardship pilot program. He  
145 then mentioned several events in Davis County including a trail cleanup at Cheese Park in  
146 Bountiful (Bonneville Shoreline Trail) on April 14<sup>th</sup> and Tunnel Springs cleanup on Saturday  
147 April 18<sup>th</sup> with Salt Lake City.

148  
149 Ryan Oakes encouraged the Committee to brainstorm ways to better engage residents with the  
150 trails including utilization of social media.

151

185 The Committee discussed having a hike with the Mayor and having a councilmember at the

188 7. TRAINING IN SHAREPOINT SITE UPDATES

190 Peter Wirthlin commented that he would share a how to do video and include a shared calendar  
191 in SharePoint for events.

192

193 Kevin Wilde introduced himself and said he was the owner of Wild Yonder Cyclery in Bountiful.  
194 He spoke on finding locations to host short track racing for cross country. He anticipated 15-30  
195 individuals weekly and rotating courses between NSL and Bountiful.

196

197 Ali Avery commented that the City was seeking public comments on the City's Trails Master  
198 Plan and encouraged Mr. Wilde to provide comment. She also suggested he could place the flyer  
199 for public feedback in his store. She also invited him to attend the trail events.

201 The Committee discussed what was needed for upcoming events in April and May including  
202 flyers with survey QR code, granola bars, water bottles, electrolytes, and water refill stations.
