**Fire Board**

- We held a fire board meeting on 4/9/26. There is nothing of consequence to report from that meeting. Mostly it was just review and approval of past minutes and a review of checks and deposits for March.

**Community Renewable Energy Agency**

- As of our board meeting on 5/4, six communities (the first of which was Springdale) have adopted the final ordinance. This represents 59% of the energy from the 19 communities who said that they will consider adopting the ordinance. We expect many of the remaining communities will adopt the ordinance in the next 2 weeks. So far, none of the communities have voted to reject the ordinance.
- Because of a state statute, the program is now called the Community Clean Energy Program. The communities involved in the program will continue to refer to ourselves as the URC (Utah Renewable Communities).
- The URC recently updated our website ([utahrenewablecommunities.org](http://utahrenewablecommunities.org)) to provide updated information on the program.
- We expect to get transmission study results on the three renewable energy projects URC has selected as our short list projects that will provide the initial renewable energy our program will supply to the grid.
- There have been several questions by constituents that have been asked different URC board members about the program. These are shown on the URC website along with the answers to those questions. The answers might help our community members with questions they have or might have in the future.
- Noticing (opt out notices) will begin in November of this year. There will be two of these that will be sent to all residents and businesses in each URC community. The program will start on 1/1/27.

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### PUBLIC WORKS (Water, Sewer & Irrigation)

- Continued daily operations at the WTP and ongoing weekly testing of the finished drinking water for toxin found in the Virgin River.
- The Sewer effluent filter building is reaching optimal TSS numbers in the effluent flow and is now able to discharge within the effluent parameters.
- SCIC customer irrigation metering installation project is nearly complete. The Town is waiting on a customer list to be provided by the SCIC in order to program the meters and enable them to start automatic monthly readings.
- Repairs have been made to the sewer main line pipe that South Central bored into in Rockville.

### STREETS

- Plans are finished and ready for bid for the Church to Quail Ridge sidewalk project. Secured \$78,000 from UDOT to help with the project. Redi-rock wall for this section is still waiting for approval through the UDOT structures team.
- Continued work on daily operations and maintenance.
