URC- In the April TC meeting we passed the required ordinance to allow our residents to participate in the Clean Communities Program through Rocky Mountain Power. A number of other communities have also passed similar ordinances which represents a little more than 50% of our participation based on power use. On the program design committee we have been continuing to further evaluate the project bids and working towards an eventual power purchase agreement in the future.

Community Health Coalition- We met last week and had some really great conversations regarding community engagement in relation to recreation month in July, what opportunities are there for connecting with people who have needs in the community, connecting with 5 counties and the AAA for aging resources, and a debrief of the Christmas bag project and what shape it may take in the future.

Community Development- Niall and Kyndal have been continuing code enforcement and refining the process with success. There has been quite a bit of change in the department lately, but they are keeping up with all of the usual activities. The historical plaque has been installed at the pioneer cemetery.

Housing- We met recently to go over updates to the Redhawk and Trapper Circle projects.

Messaging- We reviewed survey results and discussed next steps for the project as well as potential direction according to the results. We are currently considering a small group work session for more community involvement.
