

**CITY OF LOGAN  
RESOLUTION NO. 26-14**

**A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING A CLOSED AREA TO  
IGNITION OR USE OF FIREWORKS**

WHEREAS, the Chief Fire Official for the City of Logan has determined that existing or historical hazardous environmental conditions necessitate controlled use of any fireworks in certain areas within the City of Logan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §15A-5-202.5, the Municipal Council is required to designate said hazardous areas as a “Closed Area” defined by readily identifiable features and a written description and a map; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council finds that the attached description and map will designate the appropriate locations for areas closed to fireworks.

NOW, THEREFORE, LOGAN MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, finds that the historical hazardous environmental conditions have existed in the attached described area for at least two of the preceding five years and hereby approves and designates the attached written description and map as a Closed Area, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §15A-5-202.5. Said map shall also be provided to Cache County.

## **2026 Fire Works Restrictions Description**

### East Bench Closure

- East side of 1600 east from the north city boundary to Hwy 89.
- South side of Hwy 89 and Boulevard Street, from 1600 east to 200 east, then the north side of Canyon Road from 200 east to Crockett Avenue.
- East side of Crockett Avenue from Canyon Road to Riverside Drive, continuing the east side of Riverside Drive to Mountain Road, continuing the east side of the Logan River to Denzil Stewart Nature Park.
- The north and east side of the Logan City boundary from Denzil Stewart Nature Park to the southern city boundary.

### West Closure

- West side of 600 west from the north city boundary to 200 south.
- North side of 200 south from 600 west to 1000 west.
- West side of 1000 west from 200 south to the south city boundary.

Subject: 2026 Firework Restrictions and Considerations

To: Mayor and City Council

We would like to bring to your attention the upcoming fireworks season and the wildland fire predictions forecasted for this year.

During the winter season of 2025-26, Utah has seen record-setting drought conditions and record-setting low soil and fuel moisture. We will need to be extra diligent in our efforts to reduce fire risk within our valley and state. Wildfire forecast predictions for our state are at an all-time high.

Utah State Code 15A-5-202.5 states that when hazardous environmental conditions necessitate the controlled use of any ignition source, including fireworks, the legislative body of the municipality may prohibit the use of ignition sources in mountainous brush-covered areas, forest-covered areas, the wildland-urban interface area, undeveloped land, and agricultural land.

It isn't easy to predict what the environmental conditions will be in July. We do the best we can to set the restrictions based on what is known in May. We will post the restricted areas at all points of sales beginning June 24, 2026. For your review and consideration and approval, we recommend the following historical fireworks restricted areas as listed below.

#### East Bench Closure

- East side of 1600 east from the north city boundary to Hwy 89.
- South side of Hwy 89 and Boulevard Street, from 1600 east to 200 east, then the north side of Canyon Road from 200 east to Crockett Avenue.
- East side of Crockett Avenue from Canyon Road to Riverside Drive, continuing the east side of Riverside Drive to Mountain Road, continuing the east side of the Logan River to Denzil Stewart Nature Park.
- The north and east side of the Logan City boundary from Denzil Stewart Nature Park to the southern city boundary.

#### West Closure

- West side of 600 west from the north city boundary to 200 south.
- North side of 200 south from 600 west to 1000 west.
- West side of 1000 west from 200 south to the south city boundary.

#### Dates of Restrictions

- June 24, 2026 through July 25, 2026

FYI:

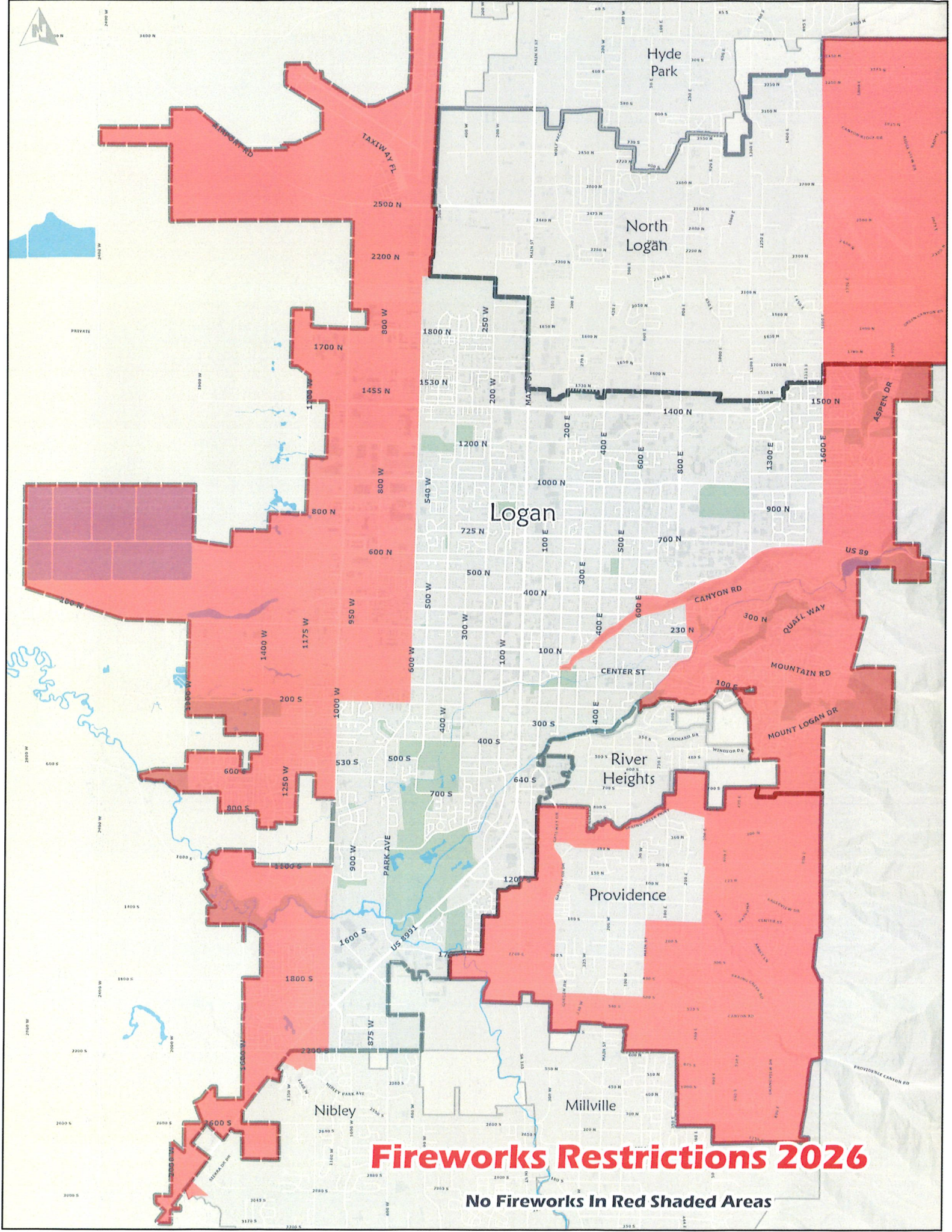
2026 Fireworks sales and discharge dates and times:

Division 1.4G fireworks can be legally sold; June 24-July 25.

Division 1.4G fireworks may be discharged between the hours of 11:00 am – 11:00 pm, July 2-July 5 (hours are extended to midnight on July 4) and July 22-July 25 (hours are extended midnight on July 24).

Fireworks restriction signs will be posted beginning on June 24 and removed July 26. Flyers indicating the restricted areas will be posted at all sales locations.
