

## UTAH PRIVACY COMMISSION

### FY 2027 Data Privacy Agenda

The Utah Privacy Commission (“Commission”) issues this Data Privacy Agenda for fiscal year 2027, pursuant to Utah Code §63A-19-204(1)(a).

1. The Commission anticipates reviewing and developing the following governmental entity privacy practices:
  - a. The Commission will study the information contained in the governmental entity privacy program report described in Utah Code §63A-19-401.3 and shall recommend which information should be a public record.
  - b. The Commission will study data governance models in coordination with the Office of Data Privacy, and will make appropriate recommendations.
  - c. The Commission shall reach out to governmental entities and solicit input concerning their experiences and concerns about privacy practices, and make appropriate legislative recommendations.
2. The Commission anticipates reviewing and developing the following educational and training materials:
  - a. The range of training materials that comply with the requirements of the Government Data Privacy Act.
  - b. The minimum requirements for employee privacy training pursuant to 63A-19-401.2, as amended by 2026 General Legislative Session Bill HB 450, lines 799-839.
  - c. Training regarding federal laws and programs, including CJIS, FERPA and HIPAA, for relevant governmental entities.
3. The Commission anticipates reviewing and developing the following best practices with respect to government privacy practices:
  - a. The Commission will work closely with the Office of Data Privacy with respect to the Technology Transparency Study mandated by Utah Code §63A-19-407(2026) as enacted by 2026 General Legislative Session Bill HB 450. In particular, and not by way of limitation, the Commission shall solicit input from the stakeholders described in subsection 407(2).
  - b. The Commission will study and make recommendations regarding the use of automated decision making by governmental entities.
  - c. The Commission will study and make recommendations concerning best practices for contracts with third parties, pursuant to Utah Code §63A-19-401.
4. The Commission anticipates studying these other items related to data privacy:
  - a. Changes to the Utah Government Data Privacy Act as a result of 2026 General Legislative Session Bill HB 450.
  - b. Automated license plate reader technology.
  - c. Developments in the implementation of the State-Endorsed Digital Identity Program, as amended by 2026 General Legislative Session Bill SB 275.
  - d. Coordinate with the Utah Cyber Center and the Office of Data Privacy regarding governmental entity cybersecurity concerns as they apply to data privacy.

The Commission may address other matters as provided for in Utah Code §63A-19-204 and other applicable law.
