Program Overview

The Creative Writing Club is designed to give upper elementary students the chance to develop their writing skills and gain confidence in a supportive environment of their peers. The club also offers an opportunity to learn new writing techniques, generate ideas and strengthen literacy skills.

Program Goals

The goal of the Creative Writing Club is to build students' confidence in expressing ideas, develop basic storytelling skills and encourage imagination and critical thinking.

Instructional Structure

Each club meeting will start with a mini lesson on different components of creating writing. Lessons will be around 10-15 minutes briefly introducing the ideas and then give students time to practice the learning through prompts, activities, and incorporation into their own projects.

Topics will include:

- How to get ideas
- Plot
- Character development
- “Show don't tell” techniques


