



Student Fee Schedule 2026-2027

Fee	Amount	Description and Spending Plans
Athletic Fee	\$100	This is the participation fee USDB may charge per student for each sport. Sports fees are used to pay a small portion of the actual cost of each sport, including officials, UHSAA costs, travel, etc.
Study Abroad	\$500	This fee may be required as a deposit for a USDB student to participate in a study abroad learning experience. These funds are retained by USDB if a student backs out of a trip after booking. The funds are returned to students who participate so they can use them during the trip for personal and educational spending activities.
Maximum Annual Fee Limit	\$1,000	This is the maximum limit USDB can charge per student each year, regardless of the number of activities.

Additional Information

- All fees listed are the maximum amount charged per student for each class or school-sponsored activity. Actual amount charged may be less.
- Students are only responsible for one fee per activity, and student fees reflect an amount equal to or less than the actual cost to USDB for a student to participate in an activity.
- The max aggregate amount for fees related to school courses, activities and other miscellaneous fees is \$1,000 per student per year
- Donations are permissible in both elementary and secondary schools, but all such requests are voluntary. A student may not be excluded from an activity or program because they did not donate.
- Any payment for student participation in a class, program, or activity is a fee and is subject to needs based fee waivers.
- The fee waiver process is described in the [USDB Student Fee Policy](#) (sec. 7.4-7.6) and the [School Fee Waiver Application](#) is provided by the Utah State Board of Education.
 - The process for obtaining a fee waiver, pursuing an alternative to a fee waiver, or appealing the denial of a fee waiver shall be administered confidentially, fairly, objectively, without delay, and in a manner that avoids stigma, embarrassment, undue attention, and unreasonable burdens on students and parents.
 - A student receiving a fee waiver or other provisions in lieu of a fee shall not be treated differently from other students or identified to students, staff members, or other persons who do not need to know of the waiver.
 - Parents or students may appeal the school's decision to deny a fee waiver by submitting an appeal request form to school within 10 days of receiving denial (see [School Fee Decision and Appeal Form](#)). Any requirement that a student pays a fee is suspended during any period in which the student's eligibility for a fee waiver is being determined or denial of a fee waiver is being appealed.

8. The [USDB Student Fee Policy](#) and the student fees above are adopted by the Utah State Board of Education in accordance with:
 - 8.1. U.C.A. Subsection [53G-7-503\(2\)](#), which requires the Board to adopt rules regarding student fees;
 - 8.2. Subsection [53G-7-504](#) which authorizes waiver of fees for eligible students with appropriate documentation; and
 - 8.3. [Board Rule R277-407](#) "School Fees."
9. Students are responsible to pay fines for any loss, breakage, or damage to school property, which is not subject to the fee waiver requirement. Official transcript may be withheld if fines are not paid in accordance with the Utah Code Ann. §[53G-8-212](#).
