MANAGERS FIELD REPORT

JUNE 3, 2026

We are at full staff as all of our seasonals are out working daily and we have also started our evening ULV work as needed. With how dry our winter was it feels as if we are a month ahead of where we normally would be. Ponds that are normally wet for at least another month are dry, and we are seeing more late summer mosquitoes than is typical for this time of year.

In May we treated 159 acres with our drone, for the season we have treated 241 acres. I purchased two pallets of granules to help get us through the season and I believe the only other pesticide we may need would be associated with airplane treatments if necessary. We have also started our surveillance trapping and the numbers are increasing but they haven't been very bad yet.

We have tested just over 40 samples with no positive pools so far. I have also ordered our testing supplies for the season and I should be getting those in the next week or so. We have had a few service requests, but while everything is dry, temperatures are still cool in the evenings and the mosquitoes seem to be in random pockets around the district. We started our bike program last week and immediately found mosquitoes in the storm drains.

We are doing our best to keep on top of the mosquitoes and as always, some days will be better than others. Thank you,
