Pump Track Seasonal Closure Policy

Effective Date: June 1, 2026

Adopted By: Wasatch County Parks & Recreation

Applies To: All Wasatch County–operated pump tracks

1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish a seasonal operating schedule for Wasatch County Pump Track to ensure public safety, protect park infrastructure, and allow for appropriate maintenance during periods of inclement weather.

2. Seasonal Operating Dates

Wasatch County Pump Track shall be **open seasonally from March 15 through November 15** of each calendar year.

3. Weather-Dependent Adjustments

The opening and closing dates may be adjusted annually at the discretion of Wasatch County Parks & Recreation due to weather conditions, including but not limited to snow accumulation, freezing temperatures, ice, or other conditions that pose safety risks or could damage park facilities.

- Early openings or delayed closures may be permitted during favorable weather conditions.
 - Delayed openings or early closures may occur when conditions are unsafe or unsuitable for use.
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4. Off-Season Closure

From **November 16 through March 14**, pump track shall be considered **closed to the public**, unless otherwise announced by Wasatch County Parks & Recreation.

Use of pump track during the closed season is prohibited and may result in enforcement actions consistent with county ordinances and park regulations.

5. Maintenance and Safety

Seasonal closures allow for:

- Protection of concrete and park features from freeze-thaw damage
 - Snow removal limitations
 - Routine inspections, repairs, and maintenance
 - Reduced risk of injury due to icy or wet conditions
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6. Public Notification

Wasatch County Parks & Recreation will make reasonable efforts to notify the public of seasonal opening and closing dates and any weather-related adjustments through:

- Posted signage at pump track
 - The county website
 - Social media or other official communication channels
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7. Authority

This policy is administered and enforced by Wasatch County Parks & Recreation under the authority granted by Wasatch County ordinances and applicable state laws.
