

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAGNA CITY COUNCIL (“THE COUNCIL”)
REPEALING AND REPLACING MAGNA CITY CODE CHAPTER 2.39
ADMINISTRATIVE ADVISORY COMMITTEES AND
ORGANIZATIONS**

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Chapter 2.39 of the Magna City Code sets forth outdated provisions for Voluntary Services Advisory Boards that are inapplicable to Magna City; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to repeal and replace Chapter 2.39 of the Magna City Code with the enactment of updated and concise requirements for Administrative Advisory Committees and Organizations; and

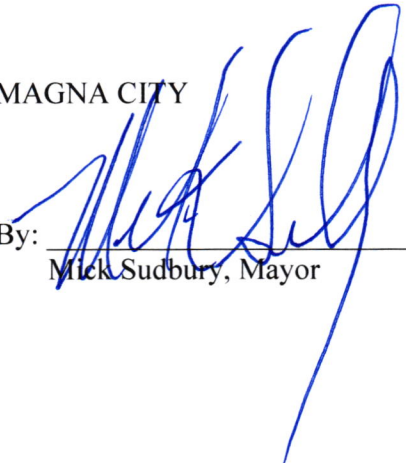
WHEREAS, the Council has determined that the requirements for Administrative Advisory Committees and Organizations set forth in Attachment A will serve the best interests of Magna City and the general public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAGNA CITY COUNCIL as follows:

1. Repeal/Enact. Chapter 2.39 of the Magna City Code is hereby repealed. Chapter 2.39 is hereby enacted in substantially the form set forth in Attachment A of this Ordinance, subject only to administrative, numbering, or grammatical corrections.
2. Severability. If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any part of this Ordinance is unconstitutional or invalid, then such portion of this Ordinance, or specific application of this Ordinance, shall be severed from the remainder, which shall continue in full force and effect.
3. Direction to Staff. Staff is authorized and directed to: (i) Correct any administrative, numbering, or grammatical errors within this Ordinance and Attachment A; and (ii) Codify and publish this Ordinance and Attachment A pursuant to all governing law, including, but not limited to, Utah Code Annotated § 10-3-711.
4. Effective Date. This Ordinance will take effect immediately upon posting pursuant to Utah Code Annotated § 10-3-712.

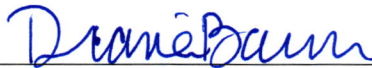

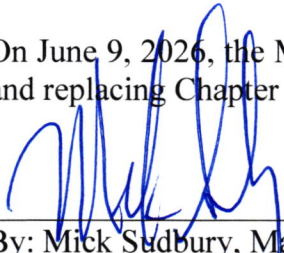

CHAPTER 2.39 ADMINISTRATIVE ADVISORY COMMITTEES AND ORGANIZATIONS

2.39.10 PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Title is to provide for the creation, membership, and operation of Administrative Advisory Committees and Organizations ("AACOS"). AACOS shall provide reports, information and recommendations to the City Manager and the City Council. AACOS created by this Title shall be self-governing, but if any provisions of this Title conflict with any provisions of any AACOS bylaws, rules, or articles of incorporation, this Title shall govern.

2.39.20 CREATION, MEMBERSHIP, AND DISSOLUTION.

AACOS may be created or dissolved by the City Manager, with the consent of the Mayor, as may be needed from time to time. AACOS created by the City Manager herein shall be composed of an appropriate number of members, appointed by the City Manager. The City Manager may remove or suspend members from AACOS at any time, for any reason.

2.39.30 FUNDS.

AACOS shall not collect or disburse any City funds.

2.39.40 OPERATIONS.

(1) AACOS operate for the exclusive purpose of providing information, data, evidence, and recommendations to the City Manager and City Council related to:

- a. Solving problems and accomplishing goals in the community;
- b. Planning and implementing social, educational, cultural and recreational activities for the community;
- c. Identifying opportunities to improve community safety; and
- d. Promoting the community pride through activities, events and programs.

(2) AACOS information, data, evidence, and recommendations shall be submitted to the City Manager in a written report.

(3) AACOS shall not be public bodies. AACOS shall not be supported by, or otherwise collect, expend or disburse public funds. AACOS are not vested with any legislative or executive responsibilities or any authority to make decisions on behalf of the City or any

public business. AACOS records shall not be public until submitted to the City. Upon receipt by the City, AACOS records shall be available to the public pursuant to the Government Records Access and Management Act under Title 63G of the Utah Code, or any successor statute.

2.39.50 MEETINGS.

- (1) The time, place, and frequency of AACOS meetings shall be determined by the AACOS.
- (2) Elected officials and City employees may attend AACOS meetings.

2.39.60 ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE.

AACOS may, but are not required to, elect a chairperson, vice chair, secretary, and additional officers as AACOS determine necessary. AACOS may, but are not required, to formally incorporate and become a legal entity.
