1. Welcome

Chair Sonnenreich called the meeting to order at 2:40 pm after a quorum was confirmed (quorum discussion starts at meeting called to order at (audio starts at 23:13 of audio recording)

2. Action and Discussion Items:

A - Approval of minutes of the April 8, 2026 meeting

Chair Sonnenreich asked for a vote to approve the April 8, 2026 minutes.

MOTION: Commissioner Vorwaller moved that the April 8, 2026 meeting minutes be approved, seconded by Commissioner Shelton. The motion passed unanimously with Commissioners Greenwood, Millington, Arbon, and Wood being absent. [Please refer to 00:24:24 in the recording to hear the motion.]

B. Introduce new Commissioner Jeremy Zabriskie, appointed by the State Board of Education, welcome Commissioner Zabriskie.

(26:28) Chair Sonnenreich asked to change the order of agenda items to hear from Representative Chevrier, who was calling in from Spain. A general discussion of her email transpired with a consensus that the UPC create a task force to dig deeper into ALPR technology. Representative Chevrier emailed the Commission sharing concerns and thoughts about Automated License Plate Reading technology/vendors, etc. The email from Rep. Chevrier will be published in letter format as part of the packet of documents for this meeting (33:44).

MOTION: Commissioner Vorwaller motioned to create a task force to study and report back on ALPR. Commissioner Jensen seconded. Motion passed unanimously (34:30) with Commissioners Greenwood, Millington, Arbon and Wood being absent.

3. Other Business – Report from Utah State Auditor’s Office

Mark Meyer, Asst. State Privacy Auditor; presentation on data and education; latest breach with Instructure / Canvas. They will publish their report.

D. Review and approve the UPC’s FY2026 Annual Agenda, per Utah Code 63A-19-204 – Chair Sonnenreich sent a last-minute addition to the document which will be republished. It shall include an addition noted as 3c “The Commission will study and make recommendations concerning best-practices for contracts with third parties, pursuant to Utah Code 63A-19-401.” (58:41)

MOTION: Commissioner McCown moved that the FY2027 Data Privacy Agenda **add section 3c** - seconded by Commissioner Vorwaller. The motion passed unanimously with Commissioners Greenwood, Millington, Arbon, and Wood being absent. [Please refer to 00:59:19 in the recording to hear the motion.] Commissioner Shelton moved to adopt the entire document with the added section 3c; seconded by Commissioner McCown (61:31)

E. Introduce Noah Passey (intern to help with Utah Privacy Commission)

F. Task Forces discussion (63:15)

- iii. SEDI program – deadline with new law to report back to Legislature? Should be an ongoing process; task force can monitor and update Privacy Commission as necessary
- iv. GRAMA classification recommendations for governmental entity privacy programs (per HB 450, lines 590-591)
- v. Annual Employee Training Guidelines (per HB 450, lines 816-839)
- vi. UPC’s administrative Rule (per HB 450, lines 546-551)
- vii. Approved to be added as item vii – new task for to study ALPR legislation and technology
- viii. Task force on third-party contracts

3. Other business – discussion on Administrative rules for the UPC – (84:30) Chair Sonnenreich discussed the change from resolution to administrative rules for the Privacy Commission; draft document to address topics of attendance (physical or remote participation); absenteeism and options to appoint a replacement.

MOTION: Chair Sonnenreich asked for a motion to approve all task forces discussed above: Commissioner Shelton moved that the Commission approve all discussed task forces; seconded by Commissioner McCown. The motion passed unanimously with Commissioners Greenwood, Millington, Arbon, and Wood being absent. [Please refer to 01:26:20 in the recording to hear the motion.] Chair Sonnenreich will reach out to individuals for assignments to be on each task force; making a recommendation for typically 5 Commissioners to be part of each task force.
