

said that some codes are more complicated than they need to be, and they want it be in “plain language” so that anyone can read through it. In terms of legislation, Mr. Hansen assured that he is hoping to have the code to the point that it is easy to determine how legislative changes will affect the city’s code.

Mr. Hansen also said that when your code is clean, putting in small fixes should be easy. Going over how his team is going to interact with the city, they worked together to attempt to determine when Mr. Hansen would come back to meet with both Planning & Zoning and the council. Upcoming events or issues in Helper such as the ever-changing highway, the Intermountain Electronics expansion, etc., were discussed. Mr. Hansen asked for the top priorities for the codes. Planning & Zoning roles versus council roles, procurement, parking, living in camping trailers, curfews in parks, and more were presented as priorities. As the meeting continued, the council and board went over signs within the city, policy statements, and tidying up codes, among other topics.

Mr. Hansen discussed the pros & cons of using the website directly to update the code, versus having further access. Mr. Hansen said code enforcement is a thankless and technical job when discussing the process with Chief Sean Draper. Mr. Hansen said that he would get back in touch with the city once he had something to share.
