1. WELCOME AND APPROVAL OF OCTOBER MEETING MINUTES - *Carlos Braceras*

Carlos welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited attendees to provide self-introductions.

Jay Fox motioned to approve the minutes. Gary Straker seconded. All Committee members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.

2. LEGISLATIVE SESSION OVERVIEW – *Lyle McMillan*

Lyle reviewed several bills from the recent legislative session related to electrified transportation.

3. UPCOMING PRIORITIES – *James Campbell*

- Annual Report

James said the annual report is due August 1st. They will try to get the draft to the committee by the end of May. Feedback to be returned by mid-June.

He mentioned the Building Utah Conference scheduled for April 13-14 in Richfield.

He mentioned the Critical Minerals Workshop which is being held August - September at USU campuses throughout the state.

4. UTAH PROGRAM OVERVIEW – *James Campbell*

- Industry Advisory Board (IAB)

New Chair: Gary Straker

Gary introduced himself and spoke about Power Innovations International (Pii), two years ago they brought him in to take over. Pii is the only manufacturer of EV equipment in the state. They employ 90 people. He said a student cohort from ASPIRE will be visiting the PII facility in June.

Spencer introduced himself and spoke about Torus. He does Government affairs work at Torus. They're working on some of the distributive energy storage.

- Case Studies

James said they are doing some analysis and case studies. He presented a list of case studies ASPIRE is currently working on and recapped the activities.

He provided more details regarding installing chargers in Bluff. The energy isn't available and the Bluff substation cannot support the installation. An upgrade cost is in the millions.

Lyle talked about some of the current issues with the regulations on the NEVI program. He said about half of the states have managed to obligate funding under the previous regulations. Utah is one of the states, and it will be a \$35M program spread over the next couple of years.

James discussed the supply chain and critical minerals. He said they are creating a special group to address this issue. The group will meet and draft a white paper focused on critical minerals related to electrification and the State of Utah. They will present the results throughout the state in workshops in August-September.

5. COMMITTEE UPDATES – *Carlos Braceras*

- State Agency Updates

Division of Air Quality

Bryce introduced his team from the Division of Environmental Quality. Bekah Ashley is a grant program manager at DEQ. She shared an update on the funding that DEQ has available.

Over \$240M for vehicle incentive programs. \$212M is dedicated to electric vehicles and more than 94% is dedicated to replacement of heavy-duty vehicles. She presented an overview of the heavy-duty incentive programs. Fleets are asked to submit a pre-application form and DEQ will find the best program for the applicant. The programs are focused on the fleet owner regardless of the manufacturer.

We want Utah to be the most advanced transportation system in the world.

July 2026 Council of State Governments will be in Salt Lake City. ASPIRE has been selected to host a tour at the Inland Port to showcase the charging and vehicles. James will provide info to share with the Committee.

Carlos assigned the Committee to take their time to review and provide comments on the draft annual report. It's the Committee's responsibility to take the time to review it. The focus of the next meeting will be the annual report.
