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1. **Welcome/Quorum Declaration**

Mayor Mollie Halterman called the meeting to order at 1:27 PM. A quorum was present. Members and guests were welcomed.

2. **Approve Minutes for March 4, 2026**

Mayor Mollie Halterman entertained a motion to approve the meeting minutes from March 04, 2026.

Motion: Mayor Tyler Allred motioned to approve the minutes from March 4, 2026.

Second by: Mayor Clayton Calloway

Vote: Unanimous Approved

3. **RPO Funding Renewal for FY 2027**

- Request to renew **\$50,000** from the Corridor Preservation Fund for Five County AOG to administer the RPO.
- Funding level remains unchanged from prior years.
- An additional \$10,000 UDOT match has already been approved.

RPO Responsibilities Highlighted

- Regional transportation coordination and stakeholder engagement
- Support for statewide and regional planning efforts
- Travel demand modeling (in coordination with UDOT)
- Long-range transportation and corridor preservation planning
- Assistance with grant writing and project development
- Coordination with UDOT planning staff

There was additional emphasis on the value of RPO coordination in leveraging state funding for local transportation projects.

Action

- **Motion: Mayor Jim Rushton motioned to recommend to the Iron County COG to approve \$50,000 from the Corridor Preservation Fund for Five County AOG to administer the RPO program.**
- **Second: Mayor Clayton Calloway**
- **Vote: Passed unanimously.**



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*** A Utah State Legislators and Senate Representative joined the meeting virtually and were welcomed to give updates between items three and four.**

Presenter: Rep. Carl Albrecht (remote)

Highlights:

- Wildfire mapping revisions delayed one year.
- Rural-focused appropriations secured:
- Approved RFA Appropriations
 - \$4.5M for water reuse for Cedar City and Enoch City
 - \$4.5M for cybersecurity training
 - \$900,000 for NEPA in Garfield County
 - Some funding for the Rural Business Accelerator
- Bills that Albrecht Worked on
 - HB222, Limitations of Actions
 - HB376, allows the Forestry Institute at Utah State University to work with watershed restoration. funding (\$2M)
 - Passed a nuclear bill
 - Interposed the elimination of the restaurant tax.
- Ongoing work on:
 - IPP plant preservation

Presenter: Barry McLerren, Senator John Curtis Office (Remote)

Highlights:

- Senator Curtis engaged in:
 - Foreign relations Committee
 - Provided information regarding the President's legal authority under the War Powers Act of 1973
 - There are concerns regarding cable infrastructure from China to Taiwan
- Legislation includes:
 - Fiscal Commission Act
 - Education transparency improvements
 - Geothermal energy development support

4. UDOT Long-Range Plan Overview

Presenter: Chris Hall (UDOT)

Key Points

- The UDOT Long-range transportation plan is updated every 4 years; the next publication is expected in 2027.
- Planning uses an improved travel demand model to project growth and traffic.
- A recent stakeholder meeting in Cedar City provided valuable input.



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Critical Strategic Topic: MPO Transition

- Iron County is approaching Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) status (population +50,000 threshold).
- Upon transition:
 - Local agencies will assume greater control over planning.
 - UDOT's role will shift from lead to supporting partner.
- Estimated timeline:
 - Census trigger: 2030; MPO implementation: ~after the next Decennial Census.

Planning Coordination

- Effort underway to align:
 - RPO Long-Range Plan
 - UDOT Long-Range Plan
 - Stakeholder engagement

Discussion Highlights

- Concern raised regarding lack of representation from west-side/unincorporated communities.
- Suggestions:
 - Improve outreach and contact lists
 - Engage fire departments, tribal representatives, and local stakeholders

5. UDOT Updates

Presenter: Chris Hall

Construction & Projects

- Extensive construction activity across Iron County:
 - SR-14, SR-143, SR-56 pavement preservation
 - SR-130 (Enoch to Minersville) pavement preservation
 - Multiple I-15 projects

Major Projects

- I-15 Southbound Passing Lane (New Harmony to Black Ridge):
 - 90% complete
 - Construction is expected possibly this year or next year.
- South Cedar Interchange:
 - Approximately 60% design completion

Other Notes

- Third-lane striping is delayed intentionally to avoid safety risks from incomplete segments.



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6. Local Transportation Projects/Studies/Updates

Cedar City

- 800 West Extension to Coal Creek Road:
 - In design and environmental phase
 - Working on the Right-of-way acquisition
- Providence Center Extension:
 - Advanced in Joint Highway Committee process
 - Recommended to Transportation Commission
- Efforts underway to secure greater regional representation on the Joint Highway Committee.

Enoch

- The Old Highway 91 project has been delayed due to the asphalt testing.
- Development projects expected to impact future transportation needs, including connections to the belt route.
- Potential future property acquisition opportunity identified along the Belt Route.

Brian Head

- Upcoming installation of:
 - Crosswalks and shuttle stops.

Parowan

- Coordination with UDOT on:
 - ATV/UTV trail expansion discussion between Parowan and Brian Head
 - Active transportation trail planning expansion.
 - Construction is underway on a sidewalk project on 200 North.
- Maverik interchange improvements underway due to development requirements.

Kanarraville / Unincorporated Areas

- Road upgrades to improve emergency access during I-15 construction closures.
- Coordination among local officials, EMS, and contractors to ensure access.
