Shannon with Rural Water Association

Shannon Rasmussen explained that she is with the Rural Water Association. She noted that Spring City won the *Best Water in Utah* award for 2026 and presented the award to water operators Cory Madsen and Trevor Hooser. Ms. Rasmussen stated that in February, two city representatives will travel to Washington, D.C., with a water sample to compete in the national competition.

Resolution 2026-09, Adoption of Certified Tax Rate for FY 2026-2027

Mayor Paul Penrod explained that the certified tax rate must be adopted each year and that there are minimal changes from the previous year. Council Member Michael Broadbent stated that the tax rate is set by the County Auditor based on the City's budget. He explained that the purpose of the certified tax rate is to maintain stable revenue; therefore, when property values increase, the tax rate decreases. There was further discussion regarding the budget on which the tax rate is based and how the process works.
