Mr. Moberly presented a list of contracts set to expire 06/30/2026. He explained that for the next Board meeting the Board would need to take action to either close or renew the listed grants. 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Agenda Item 4a [10:47]	<u>Board Business; 4.a Annual Required Trainings (OPMA, GRAMA) provided by Paul Tonks:</u> Chair Curtis invited Paul Tonks, the Board's attorney, to deliver the annual training for the Open and Public Meetings Act (OPMA) and Government Records Access and Management Act (GRAMA). Following the training, the Board asked for copies of the training so they could share it with their chapters. Additionally, they asked how to discern which records are included in a GRAMA request using the example of notes taken on a Post-it or a recording made on a person's phone which is not the official recording.	
Agenda Item 4b [27:54]	<u>Board Business; Allocation of funding for non-chapter requested projects:</u> The Chair started the conversation stating that there was \$160,802.70 in non-chapter entity requests and \$232,301.54 in chapter requests for non-chapter funding which was more than the current available balance for allocation. He told the Board that there would be some choices to make in how the non-chapter funds could be allocated and then they could choose to do the allocation. Board member Todacheenie said that he wished the project information could be sent in the mail ahead of the meetings and that he was not comfortable making decisions upfront just hearing over the phone. Commissioner Harvey also clarified the situation the Board was in with the applications to use non-chapter funds far exceeding the non-chapter balance. Chair Curtis summarized after the discussion that the Board would prefer to hear the projects first rather than moving the allocations around first.

The Chairman asked Mr. Moberly to present the action needed for the expiring grants. Mr. Moberly shared a list of grants that had expired at the end of 2025. He said that he and Tony Dayish had been working with the chapters to confirm which grants needed to be renewed. As presented to the Board in the premeeting packet the list needed one update – the Navajo Chapter had requested for grant #580 to be “renewed” which was originally marked as “closeout”. Mr. Grayeyes stated that the Navajo Mountain chapter is requesting that all their listed grants be extended/renewed, confirming Mr. Moberly’s remark that #580 did need to be renewed. Corri Benally asked if the remaining balance for grant #532 could be used for repairs. Staff’s recommendation included a change to the scope of work to include the repairs. Board member Begay



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	asked about the Oljato projects and Karilyn Begay stated that the original powerline projects #579, #639 and #661 had been completed but that they would like to keep the grants open for other projects in the area. The Chair and Mr. Moberly explained that generally unused funds from the closed grants would return to the chapter to use but that the chapter would need to make a new project application for the Board's approval since these projects were not part of the original application's scope of work. Mr. Dayish added and Mr. Moberly confirmed that the funds for #639 and #661 were originally non-chapter funds and the remaining funds would be returned to the non-chapter account and not the Oljato chapter account. Stephanie Holly said that the chapter did not recall applying for non-chapter funds. Mr. Moberly said he would do some research and let her and chapter know. Commissioner Harvey asked to verify that both Navajo Mountain grants would be renewed. Commissioner Harvey asked the Aneth chapter to confirm the three projects that were slated on the list to not be renewed, and they confirmed that that was correct. Following his questions Commissioner Harvey motioned and there was no discussion to the motion. <i>Motion</i> Commissioner Jamie Harvey made a motion and Board member Bill Todacheenie seconded the motion to follow staff's proposed recommendation for the list of grants ready to be renewed or left in close out, except for grant #580 that was listed as closeout but that should be renewed. <i>The motion passed unanimously by a vote of affirmation with affirmative votes from Board member Bill Todacheenie, Board member Willis Begay, Board member Jamie Harvey, Board member Silvia Stubbs and Chairman Evan Curtis.</i>

Agenda item 5.d and 5.e [54:31]	<u>Project Applications:</u> 5.d Navajo Mountain Chapter - Cryshal Graymountain - Surveys \$450 requested for clearances required for homesite lease including archeological clearances, biological clearances, and land survey for Cryshal Graymountain. UNTF is requested to match \$450. 5.e Navajo Mountain Chapter - Utah Learning Center / Warehouse \$10,000 requested to provide upgrades to the Utah Learning Center/Warehouse to improve the facility's functionality, safety, and aesthetics while extending the building's usable lifespan, reduce operational costs, and improve occupant comfort. Improvements include structural repairs, installation of energy-efficient systems, interior and exterior refurbishments, updates to comply with current building codes. UNTF is requested to match \$10,000 Chairman Curtis invited Mr. Moberly to give an overview of the Navajo Mountain Chapter project requests. There were no questions from the Board. Mr. Dayish added that the Learning Center would also be serving as temporary office space while the Navajo Mountain chapterhouse office space is rebuilt. Motion <i>Commissioner Jamie Harvey made a motion to approve the projects for Navajo Mountain Chapter's applications for \$450 for surveys and \$10,000 for Utah Learning Center / Warehouse upgrades as outlined by staff. Board member Bill Todacheenie seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of affirmation with affirmative votes from Board member Bill Todacheenie, Board member Willis Begay, Board member Jamie Harvey, Board member Silvia Stubbs and Chairman Evan Curtis.</i>	Motion – Passed



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Agenda item 5.f [56:59] and [01:18:25]	<u>Project Applications; 5.f Utah Navajo Trust Fund - Project Shortfall Funding for Non-Chapter funds:</u> Request of non-chapter funding sufficient cover past funding shortfalls and complete 23 housing projects, previously approved through the chapters. Chairman Curtis invited Mr. Moberly to give an overview of the request. He mentioned that 3 of the projects had not previously come before the Board and that they may need to. The Chair invited Mr. Dayish and Mr. Bergman to add comments. Mr. Bergman said that the amounts requested are mostly small shortages from nearly completed projects. He explained that the reason for requesting non-chapter funds is because it would be difficult to go back to the chapters for a handful of little individual sums. After the Board had a chance to ask questions, the Chair had them pause on deciding until they could hear about the other requests for non-chapter funds. The Board reviewed and discussed item 5.g (Mission Discovery School) and 5.i-w (Red Mesa Chapter requests). Following a discussion of those requests the Board returned to this item to make a decision. Chairman Curtis summarized for the Board that the request was for non-chapter funds sufficient to fill the funding gaps and complete 23 housing projects throughout the Chapters. He also stated that staff's recommendation would be to exclude the three UNTF projects that had not yet come before the Board. Commissioner Harvey asked how the decision to support the Trust Fund's request would impact Red Mesa's request and whether the Board should wait to decide on Red Mesa until after their numbers are clearer and the UNTF portion is determined. The Chairman agreed that the decision to fund the UNTF's request would leave less available for Red Mesa. <i>Motion</i> <i>Commissioner Jamie Harvey made a motion to approve the request for the Utah Navajo Trust Fund, for funding of project shortfalls with the exception of the three UNTF only projects that had not been heard before the Board. Board member Bill Todacheenie seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of affirmation with affirmative votes from Board member Bill Todacheenie, Board member Willis Begay, Board member Jamie Harvey, Board member Silvia Stubbs and Chairman Evan Curtis.</i>	Motion – Passed
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Agenda item 5.g [01:01:13]	<u>Project Applications; 5.g Mission Discovery School - Monument Valley Summer Camp, Request is for non-Chapter funds:</u> \$43,521 requested to hold the Monument Valley Summer Camp, a free 6-week educational program providing 60 hours of direct instruction for up to 40 students. Including creation of reusable curriculum, staffing for four educators, and essential repairs to the old Head Start building in Monument Valley to meet fire safety codes. There is \$1,000 in parent fundraising estimated as a match. Chairman Curtis invited Mr. Moberly to give an overview of the project. Commissioner Stubbs added to Mr. Moberly's overview saying that the school is using and refurbishing an abandoned building and doing a really great job cleaning and fixing it. She continued, saying that the building will be used for a lot of purposes during the school year such as working with special needs children that don't fit in the typical education programs, parent classes and educator training. Board member Begay added concerns about the building's availability due to expired leases, a possible sale without approval from the Navajo Nation, and multiple title transfers. He advocated for the Board to wait to decide until the building's status has been cleared up. Commissioner Harvey asked if the chapter owned the building. <i>Motion</i> <i>Board member Willis Begay made a motion to table the decision on \$43,524 requested for Monument Summer Camp until the ambiguity around the building and land can be cleared-up. Board member Bill Todacheenie seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of affirmation with affirmative votes from Board member Bill Todacheenie, Board member Willis Begay, Board member Jamie Harvey, Board member Silvia Stubbs and Chairman Evan Curtis.</i>	Motion – Tabled

Agenda item 5.i [01:09:30] and [01:24:20]	<u>Project Applications; 5.i-5.w Red Mesa Chapter - New Home Projects:</u> Chairman Curtis asked Mr. Moberly to speak about the Red Mesa Chapter's requests before the Board decided on the Navajo Trust Fund request because the Red Mesa requests also included non-chapter funds. Red Mesa had applications for funding 16 new homes. Mr. Moberly said that the requests were for more than the chapter had available and more than the non-chapter account had available as well. He invited Mr. Dayish to go through the funding plan that Red Mesa put together. He complimented them on getting all the documents together and ready for review. He stated that the part of the funding plan that is not yet in place would be reviewed and voted on in June at the next Diné Advisory Committee and the Navajo Trust Fund Board meeting. Mr. Dayish said that the residents are working on their end to get their documentation ready and complete. He explained that their plan would involve both chapter and non-chapter funds from both NRF and UNTF so that multiple funding sources could be put to work for these projects. He added that the list also contained some projects that had already received their funding and would not be part of a new request but are just part of the overall list of projects that Red Mesa was working on. Mr. Dayish shared a Spreadsheet of the Red Mesa Chapter's housing funding plan. The Spreadsheet included additional funding sources like the Olene Walker Housing Loan Fund and the Veteran's Housing program. The Chair thanked Mr. Dayish for reviewing the funding plan for Red Mesa. He explained that he wanted to give the Board a chance to hear all the requests for non-chapter funds before making decisions. The Chairman returned the Board to item 5.f to decide on that request. Chairman Curtis restated that the Board had discussed holding off on the Red Mesa projects until they have a clearer picture of the total funds being requested. He asked if any representatives from Red Mesa were on the call to talk a little about how they would like to proceed. Ronalda Joe from Red Mesa Chapter said that the request could wait until the next funding meeting and in the meantime they would keep working to get everything in place and clear up the totals both for the request and for the availability. <i>Motion</i>	No Motion
