A. Report regarding Victims of Crime Act - VOCA

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: The Santa Clara-Ivins Police Department provided an update regarding the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) grant program. The report highlighted victim advocacy services provided throughout the region, including crisis intervention, safety planning, assistance with protective orders, coordination with the Division of Child and Family Services, and support for victims of domestic violence, child abuse, stalking, and other crimes. The grant currently funds approximately 75 percent of the Victim Services Coordinator position and continues to remain in good standing with all reporting requirements. Although the grant experienced a significant funding reduction, victim services have continued without interruption through efficient use of available resources and increased community outreach efforts. H. Discussion regarding potential impacts of the Black Desert Resort and Shivwits project

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: The Mayor and City Council discussed the potential impacts of the proposed Black Desert Resort and Shivwits development on City services and infrastructure, including emergency services, transportation, utilities, and sewer infrastructure. The Shivwits Band is a sovereign nation and the City's role is to evaluate and prepare for potential impacts to City services and infrastructure Recognizing the project remains conceptual, the City will continue to evaluate potential impacts and maintain communication with the Shivwits Band and Black Desert Resort representatives as additional information becomes available. A. Continued discussion to consider approval of Ordinance No. 2026-14, an Ordinance of Ivins City, Utah, approving Fiscal Year 2027 salaries and/or salary ranges for elected officials, statutory officers and department heads

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: The Mayor and City Council discussed the distinction between cost-of-living adjustments and merit increases, employee retention, market competitiveness, fiscal responsibility, and compensation practices within municipal government,

as well as the purpose of annual cost-of-living adjustments to maintain employees' purchasing power during periods of inflation. It was explained that merit increases recognize employee performance, growth, and increased proficiency. They discussed the City's compensation study, salary ranges, employee recruitment and retention, and the financial impact of turnover compared to retaining experienced employees. One City Council Member expressed support for the cost-of-living adjustment but opposed the merit increase, citing concerns regarding public perception following the recent Truth in Taxation process. The other City Council Members expressed support for both adjustments, noting the importance of recognizing employee performance and maintaining competitive compensation. B. Discuss and consider approval of Resolution No. 2026-11R, a Resolution of Ivins City, Utah, approving the Certified Property Tax Rate for Calendar Year 2026

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: The Finance Director explained that adoption of the Certified Property Tax Rate is required annually and does not constitute an increase in property taxes. He explained that the certified tax rate is calculated by the Utah State Tax Commission and adjusts to ensure the City receives the same property tax revenue from existing properties, exclusive of new growth. Although the certified rate increased due to declining assessed property values, the overall revenue generated from existing properties remains unchanged. The Mayor and City Council discussed how the certified rate is established and clarified that the City does not determine the certified rate unless it chooses to go through the Truth in Taxation process. BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: The Finance Director presented the Fiscal Year 2027 Final Budget, noting revisions due to lower-than-expected sales tax revenue resulting from a reduced population by the State, partially offset by higher property tax revenue. The budget includes funding for the Fire Station Remodel and Expansion, additions to fund balance and roadway reserves, planned sewer and storm drain rate adjustments, and several capital improvement projects. E. Discuss and consider approval of a Memorandum of Understanding with Utah Tech University

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: A representative from Utah Tech University referred to a Memorandum of Understanding relating to operation of the region's Public, Educational and Government (PEG) Channel. The agreement authorizes Utah Tech University to administer the PEG Channel funding received through existing cable franchise agreements with TDS. Discussion included the history of the PEG Channel, the transition of administration from the former Community Education Channel, future programming opportunities, student involvement through Utah Tech University, and the potential for participating municipalities to provide locally produced educational and governmental programming. F. Discuss and consider extension of a Memorandum of Understanding and Agreement between ENLAW LLC as the developer of Black Desert Resort and Ivins City regarding the Western Corridor

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: The Mayor and City Council discussed a proposed extension to the Memorandum of Understanding between Ivins City and ENLAW LLC regarding completion of improvements associated with the Western Corridor and Hamlin Parkway. A representative from Black Desert Resort explained that additional time is needed to complete the required roadway improvements due to project timing and coordination with adjacent development. The extension would continue to allow certificates of occupancy for completed homes within North Village while deferring completion of a portion of Hamlin Parkway until the adjacent development is prepared to complete its segment. It was explained that completing only a portion of the roadway would result in a roadway terminating without public access and would create operational and public safety concerns.
