RESOLUTION No. 2026-04

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PLYMOUTH, UTAH, ESTABLISHING A CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND FOR THE ACCUMULATION AND EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS FOR APPROVED TOWN PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Plymouth, Utah, recognizes the need to plan for, acquire, and construct long-term municipal capital improvements, infrastructure, and facilities; and

WHEREAS, Utah Code Section 10-6-109 allows for the establishment and maintenance of restrictions on municipal funds for specific future purposes; and

WHEREAS, creating a dedicated Capital Projects Fund ensures greater financial transparency, regulatory compliance, and accountability by separating capital improvement monies from general operating funds; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that establishing this fund serves the best financial interests of the Town and promotes the health, safety, and welfare of its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Plymouth, Utah, as follows:

1. **Establishment of Fund.** There is hereby created and established a special revenue/governmental fund to be known as the "Plymouth Capital Projects Fund."
2. **Purpose of Fund.** The fund shall be used exclusively to receive, hold, and expend monies dedicated to the acquisition, construction, replacement, or major repair of municipal infrastructure, buildings, equipment, and other long-term capital assets.
3. **Sources of Revenue.** The Capital Projects Fund may be funded by direct appropriations from the General Fund, local grants, state or federal funds, donations, interest earnings generated by the fund itself, or any other legally available revenue source designated by the Town Council.
4. **Administration and Compliance.** All expenditures from this fund shall be authorized through the town's standard annual budget or budget amendment processes. All unexpended balances at the end of a fiscal year shall remain within the Capital Projects Fund and roll forward into the subsequent fiscal year for the designated purposes.
5. **Severability.** If any section, clause, or provision of this Resolution is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining allocations and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
6. **Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Plymouth Town Council, 4 members present and 4 members voting in favor thereof,
