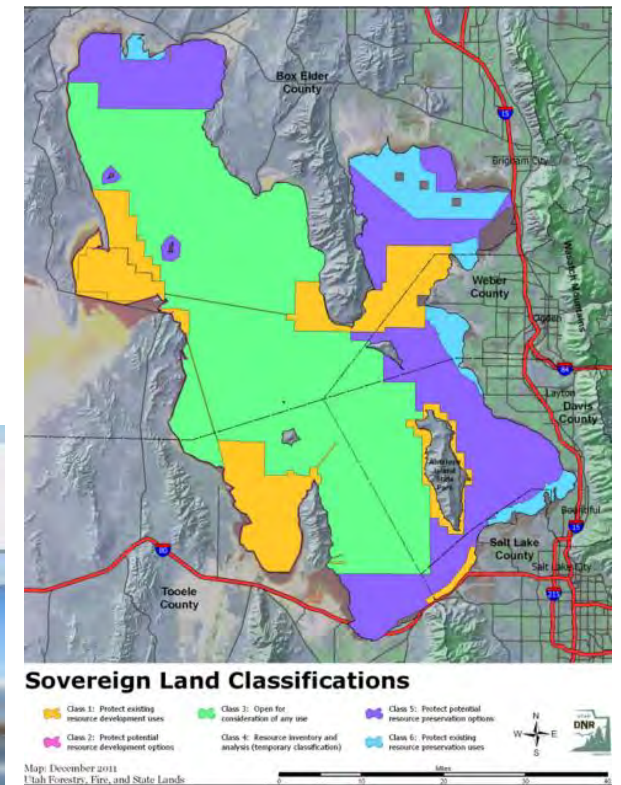
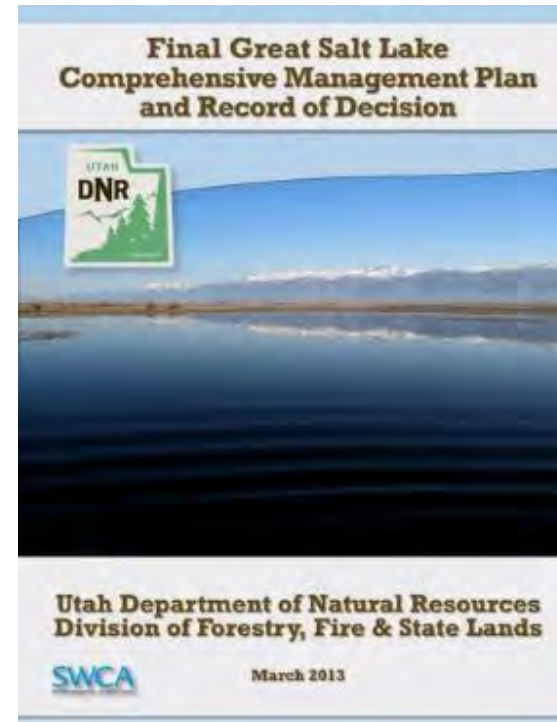

What they do

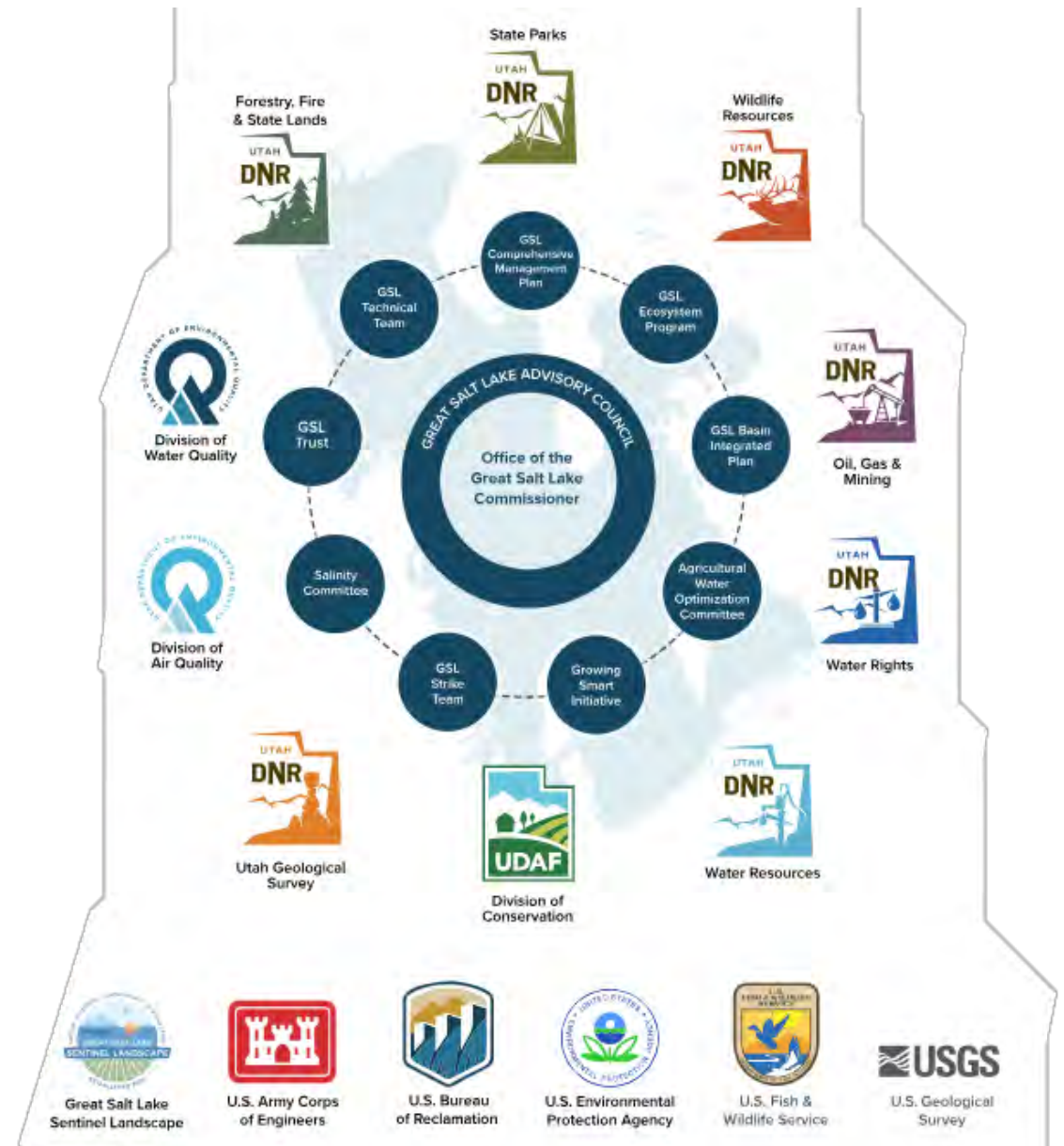
- ✓ Manage sovereign lands under the principles of the public trust doctrine
- ✓ Management strategies that balance various interests
- ✓ Ensure that resources are managed under multiple-use, sustained-yield principles
- ✓ Clarify allowable uses on sovereign lands



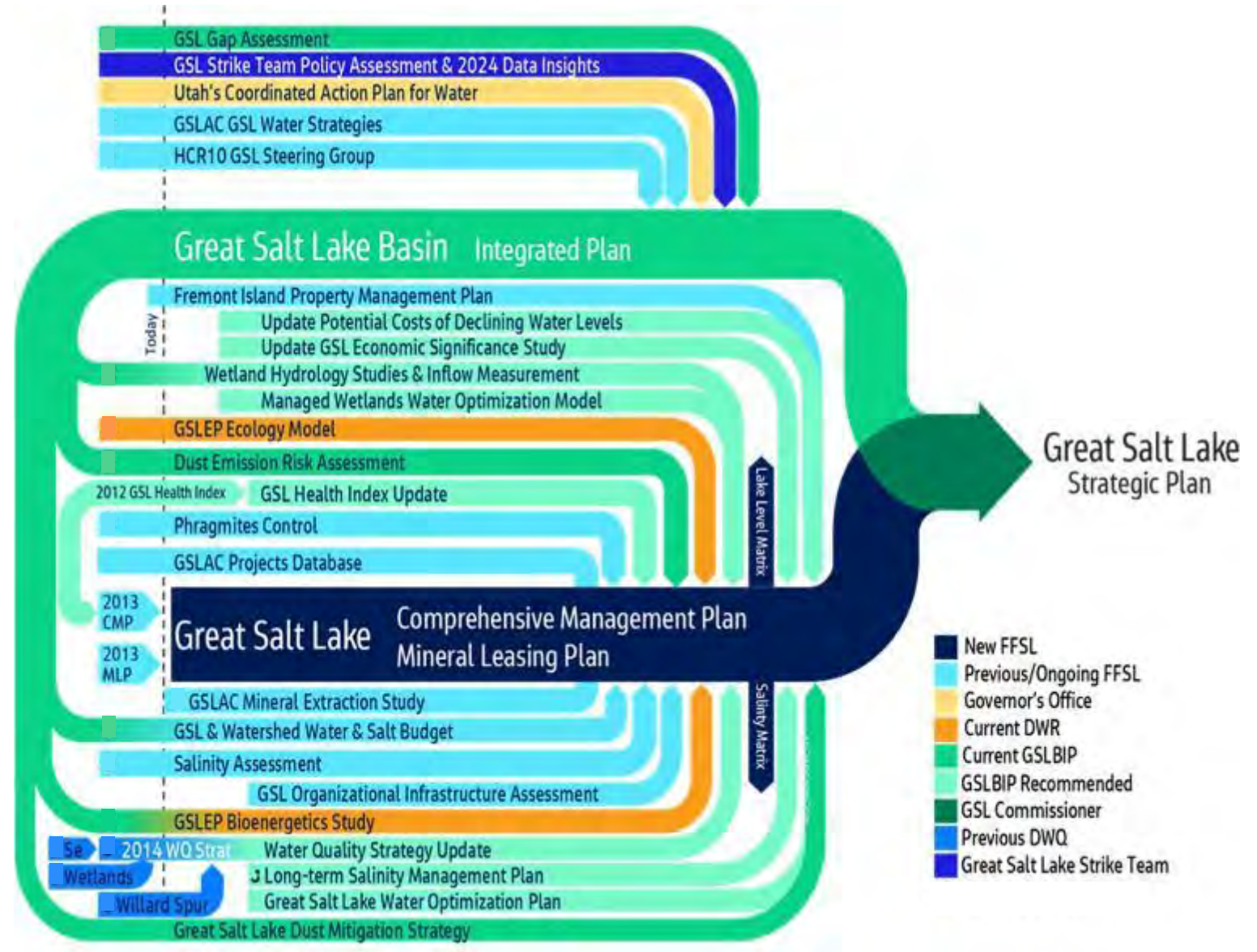
About the CMPs

What they don't do

- ✗ Duplicate the work of other agencies
- ✗ Upstream water management
- ✗ Water conservation or supply management decisions
- ✗ Reservoir storage operations
- ✗ Surface or groundwater inflow management decisions

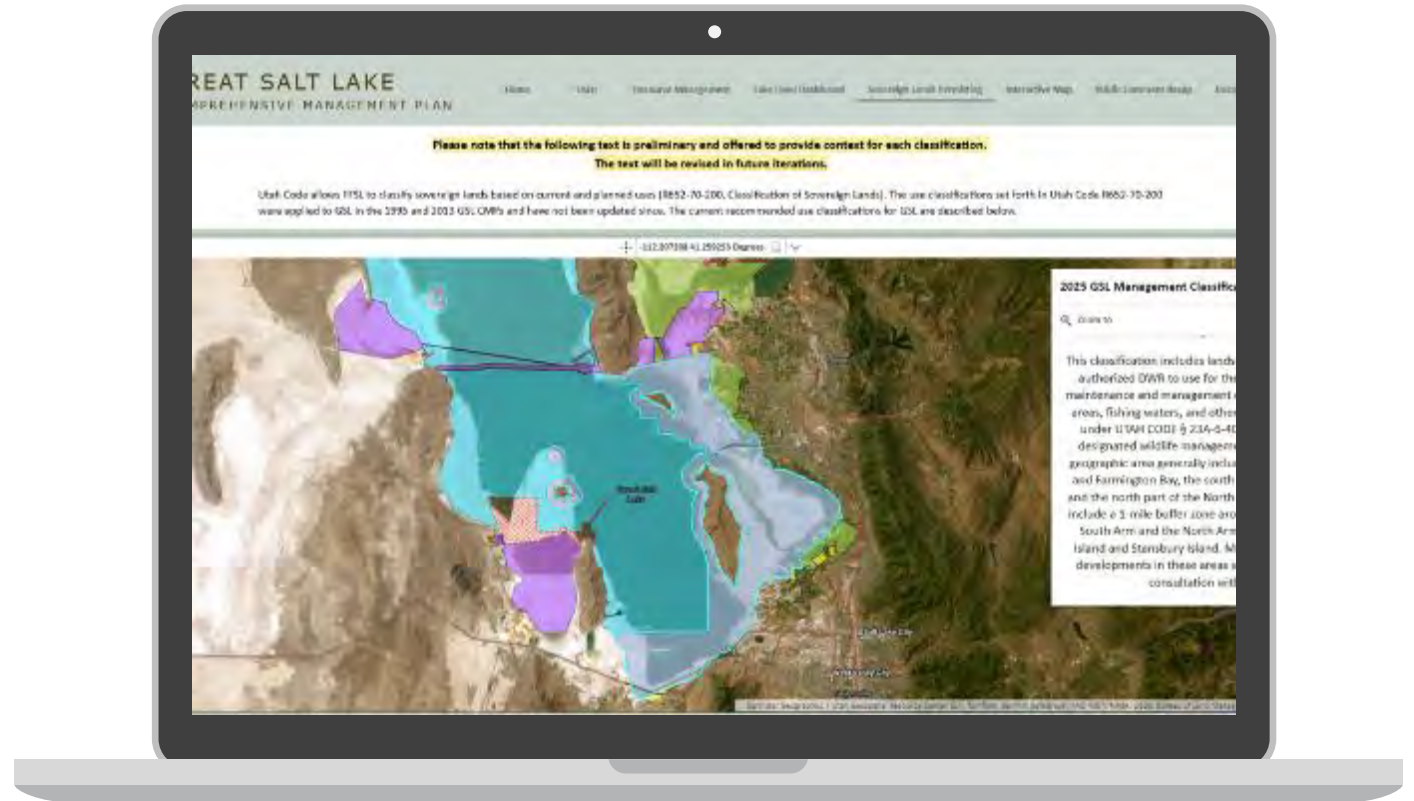


A LOT of Collaboration



A Modern Update – Online Tool

- Visualizes current vulnerabilities based on lake level and salinity
- Links lake-level conditions with corresponding management strategies
- Considers and includes strategies for the “what if?”
- Designed for ongoing updates as conditions and knowledge evolve

Lake-Level Resource Condition

No major impacts from lake level.

Resource Management Actions at Current Lake Level

Participate with DWQ to research water quality implications of high lake levels.

Management Strategies with All Lake Levels

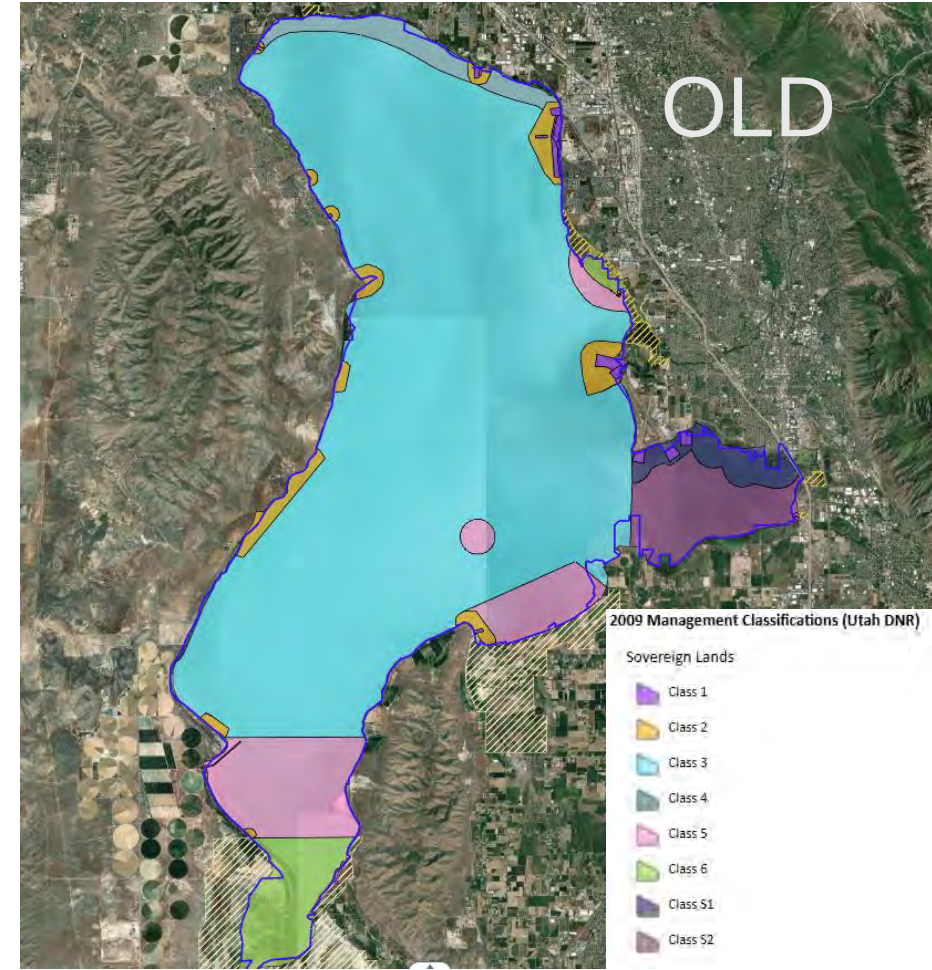
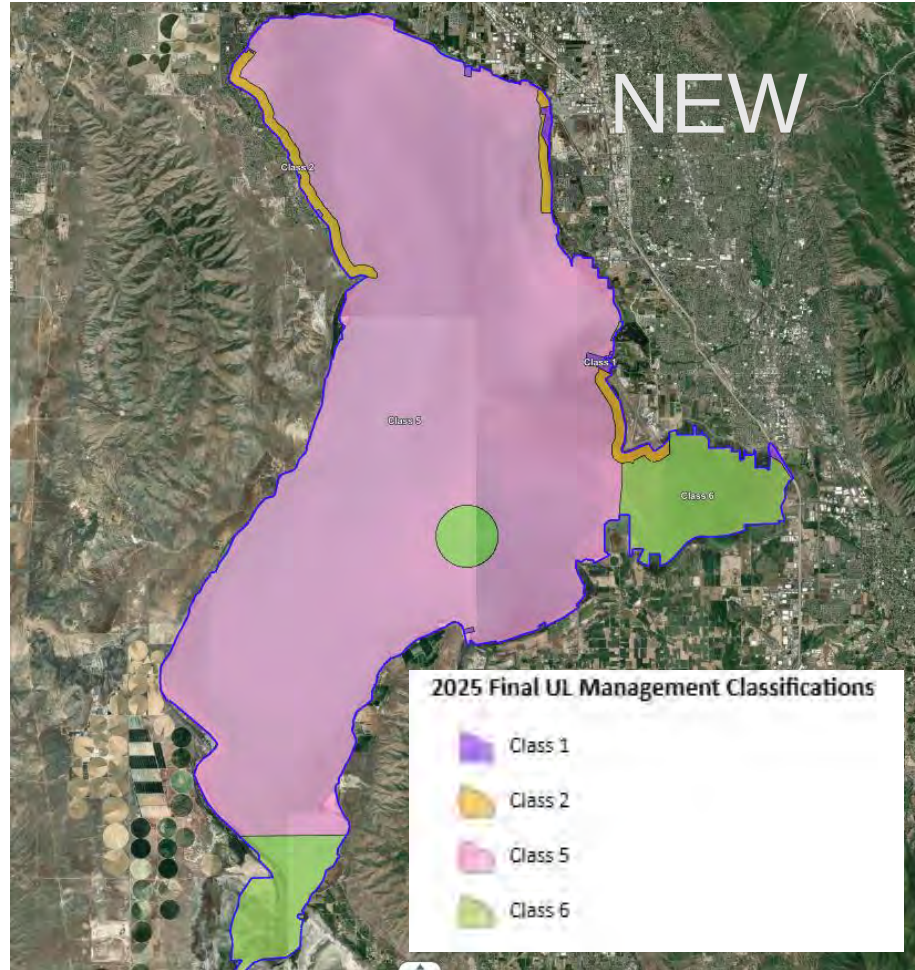
- When considering new permits or permit renewals, coordinate leasing with DWQ-required permits (UPES, general, stormwater, and the associated antidegradation review) where applicable, including research on negative water quality impacts associated with actions.
- Support DWQ to establish numeric criteria for mercury, nutrients, and other contaminants as they are identified and as they have the potential to impact GSL recreation and aquatic life beneficial uses.
- Communicate new project proposals to DWQ to help ensure impacts do not affect compliance with the existing narrative standard and the numeric selenium standard.
- Continue to support DWQ's efforts to assess the water quality condition of the lake and track contaminants of concern.
- Coordinate with DWQ to help ensure compliance with Utah Water Quality Act regulations (UTAH ADMIN. CODE R317).

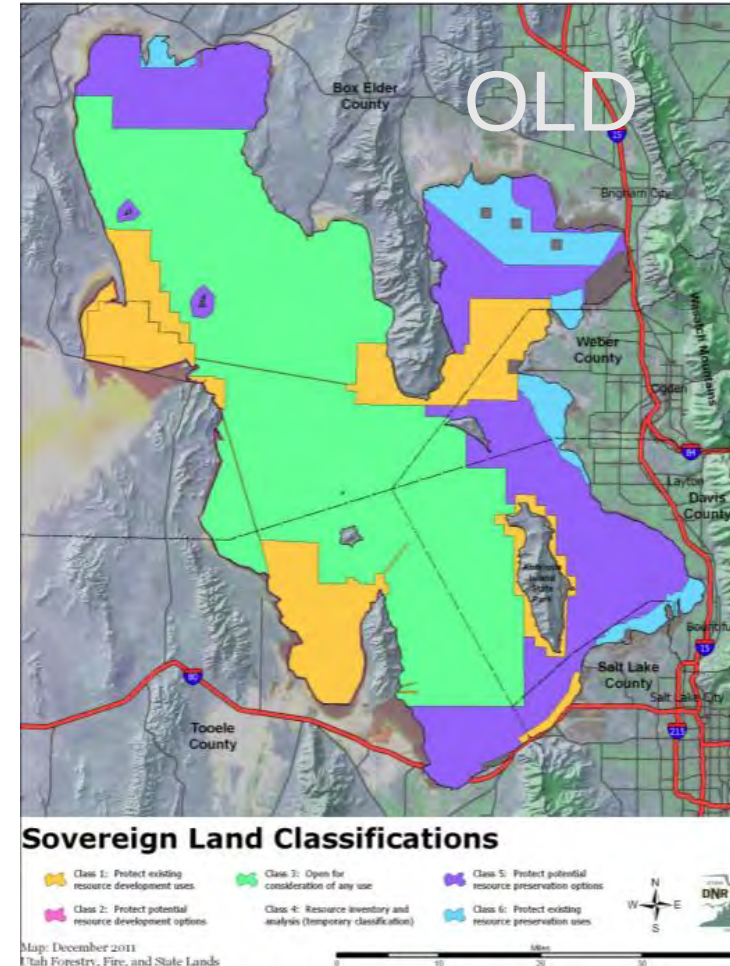
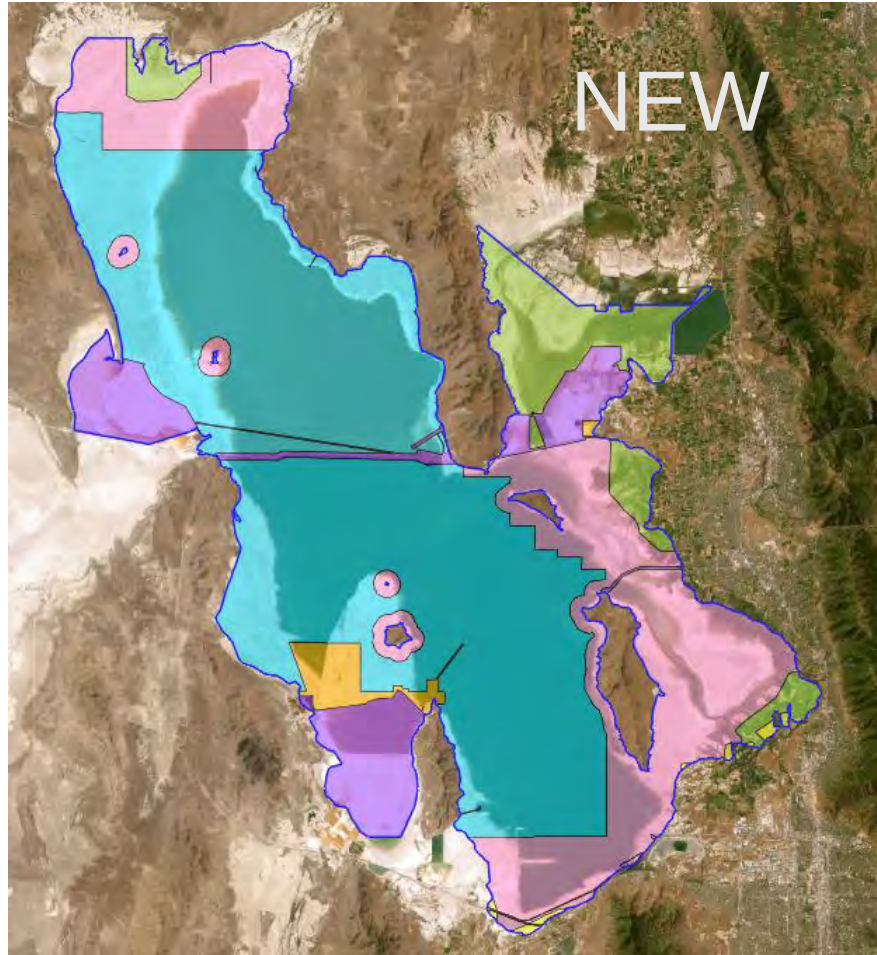
FFSL does not have jurisdiction over the water quality of Great Salt Lake, but does have a responsibility to coordinate the efforts of other agencies to protect the public trust through multiple-use, sustained yield principles.

FFSL is currently working with DWQ to coordinate the water quality monitoring activities and to ensure that the data is used to inform the lake's management and to ensure the collection of

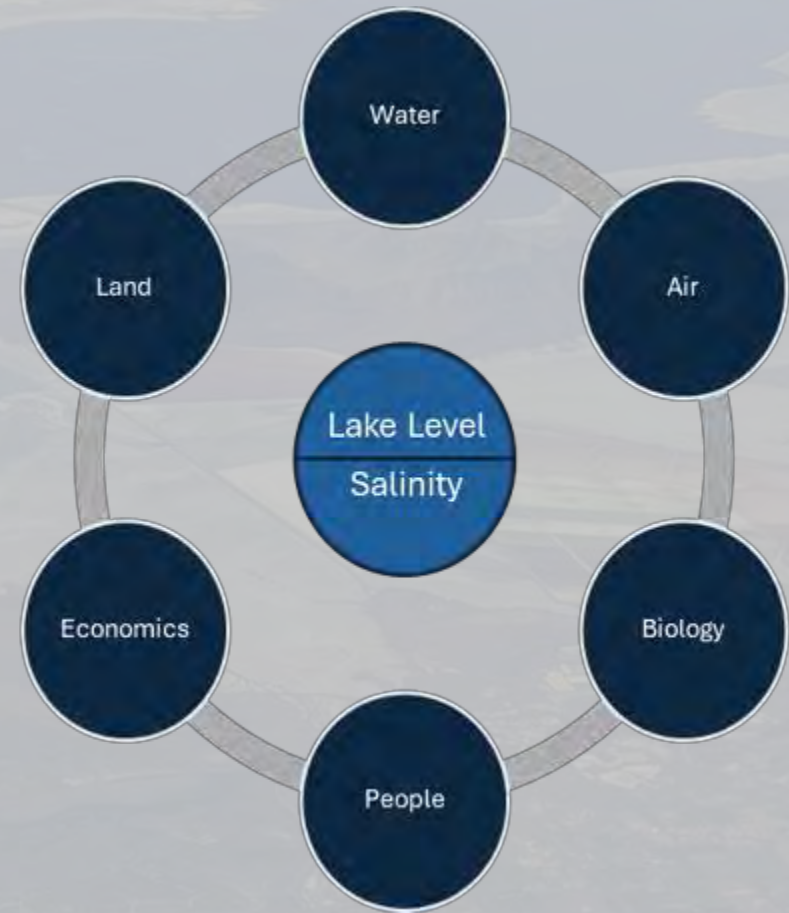

- Our goal is to guide management decisions



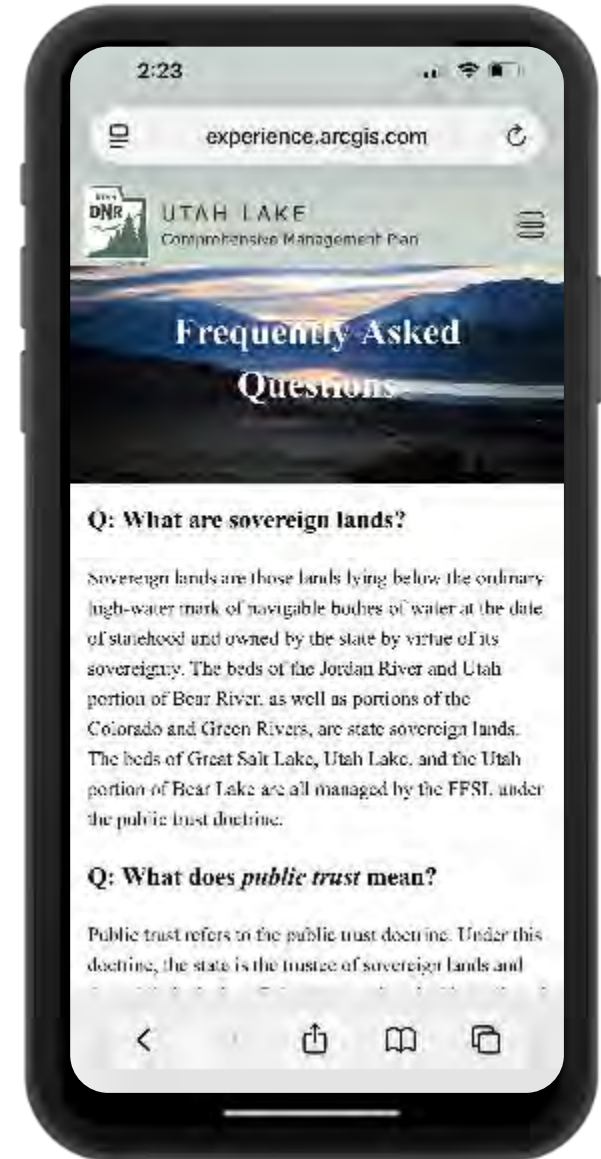

2026 Wildland Fire Response and Fuels Reduction

- Bonneville Fire behind the U: Significant effort was made to keep the fire from approaching City Creek Canyon and impacting the watershed
- Emigration Canyon hazardous fuels mitigation work-
 - Parleys Canyon WRI Fuel Mitigation Project (Adjacent Canyon to Emigration).
 - Freeze Creek Shaded Fuel Break
 - Emigration Chipper Days: Work done by UFA, ongoing for the last 3 to 4 years
 - North Salt Lake WRI Chipping project (mouth of Emigration Canyon)
- Beginning fuels mitigation work with the Cardiff Fork neighborhood in Big Cottonwood



Legislative Updates

- 2022 revisions to Utah Code 73-3-30: allows FFSL to lease and buy water rights for use on sovereign lands
- GSL Preservation Act – Utah Code 65A-17: hugely impactful to management of GSL and its mineral resources
