

## BUDGET OFFICER'S STATEMENT

### NORTH LOGAN CITY

#### Fiscal Year 2026–2027 BUDGET

In accordance with the requirements of the State of Utah Truth-in-Taxation law, I hereby state that the INTERIM Budget for North Logan City for the fiscal year 2026–2027 has been prepared in compliance with applicable provisions of the Utah Truth-in-Taxation Law and reflects a thorough evaluation of anticipated revenues, expenditures, and the operational needs of the City.

As required by law, a **Property Tax Impact Schedule** has been prepared and is included with this budget.

North Logan City is considering a General Fund property tax increase of approximately **7.5%** and a **10.0%** Library Fund property tax increase, which is projected to be a total **7.89%** Property Tax increase and is expected to generate an additional **\$139,615** in additional ad valorem tax revenue, consisting of:

- **\$93,812 from the General Fund increase, and**
- **\$45,803 from the Library Fund increase:**

Estimated impact to an average residence of \$659,000 (AHV):

- **Residential Property:** approximately **\$28.99 annual increase** (comprised of \$19.45 from the General Fund increase and \$9.54 from the Library Fund increase)

Estimated impact to an average commercial property of \$2,544,465:

- **Business Property:** approximately **\$203.74 annual increase** (comprised of \$136.70 from the General Fund increase and \$67.04 from the Library Fund increase)

The Property Tax Impact Schedule also outlines the operational impacts if the proposed increase is adopted, including:

#### **For General Fund Operations:**

- \$32,318 for Police Department: to provide competitive salary increases to current officers for retention purposes.
- \$61,494 for Logan City's Fire Department: to help meet the contract rate increase.

#### **For Library Fund Operations:**

- \$45,803 for Library Department: to cover the new Community Center utilities, and provide some community programs in the Community Center.

In compliance with Truth-in-Taxation requirements, the City provided notice of and has conducted one public hearing and will conduct another public hearing as required by law, where members of the public will have an opportunity to comment on the proposed budget and the proposed property tax increase. Instructions for virtual participation has been posted online on the Utah Public Meeting Notice website and on the [www.northlogancity.gov](http://www.northlogancity.gov) website no later than 24 hours before the public hearing.
