33 **#1 Welcome and Introductions**

35 **Mayor Alder** welcomed everyone and asked for introductions

37 **#2 Approval of Minutes**

39 **ACTION: A motion was made by Mayor Cox to approve the minutes from**
40 **March 23, 2026 and was seconded by Mayor Peterson. The vote in favor**
41 **was unanimous, 13-0.**

43 **#3 Approval of Expenses/Bills**

1 **ACTION: A motion was made by Mr. Beutler to approve the expenses/bills**
2 **and was seconded by Mayor Jacobsen. The vote in favor was unanimous,**
3 **13-0.**

5 **#4 Consider approving FY2027 Draft Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)**

6
7 **Gilbert** reviewed the UPWP.

8
9 **ACTION: A motion was made by Mr. Beutler to approve the FY2027 Unified**
10 **Planning Work Program and was seconded by Commissioner Borup. The**
11 **vote in favor was unanimous, 13-0.**

13 **#5 Discuss Advanced Corridor Preservation Challenges**

14
15 **Gilbert** reviewed the advanced corridor preservation challenges. Currently, the CMPO is
16 not flexible enough to quickly acquire property for right of ways. Staff is looking for a way
17 to help solve the issue of being flexible enough to acquire property when it comes on the
18 market.

19
20 **CMPO** and **Staff** discussed the different avenues and funding options to help resolve
21 some of the problem with CMPO being able to acquire property for corridor preservation.
22 This item will come back to the CMPO at a future meeting for a more in depth
23 discussion.

25 **#6 Consider 2025 CMPO Regional Transportation Plan Amendment – Wolf**
26 **Pack/Bob Cat Way Alignment Amendment**

27
28 **Gilbert** reviewed the information for the Wolf Pack/Bob Cat Way alignment amendment.

30 **CMPO** and **Staff** discussed minimizing impacts to property owners.

32 **Mayor Cox** explained Hyde Park's support for route alternative 1.

34 **Executive Daines** explained the County's support for route alternative 3.

35
36 **CMPO** and **Staff** discussed route 3 and how the road would be built, the history between
37 choosing the original route, the reason for route 3, the pros and cons of route 1 and 3,
38 how a COG application will need to be made by Hyde Park if another route other than 1
39 is chosen, the possibility of building two different routes,

40
41 **ACTION: A motion was made by Executive Daines to approve alternative**
42 **route 3 and was seconded by Mayor Jacobsen. The vote in favor was 10-3.**

44 **#7 Public Hearing – CMPO FY 2026 Budget (Amendment #3)**

46 **Gilbert** reviewed amendment #3 for Hyde Park requesting funds.

1 **Mayor Alder** opened the public hearing.

5 **Mayor Alder** closed the public hearing.

7 **#8 Consider Amending CMPO FY 2026 Budget (Amendment #3)**

8 **Gilbert** reviewed the funds being requested by Hyde Park for the budget amendment.

9
10 **CMPO** and **Staff** discussed using COG funds or to use CMPO funds to reimbursement
11 Hyde Park.

13 **ACTION: A motion was made by Ms. Simmonds to approve the 2026**
14 **budget amendment #3 with the stipulation to approve engineering as**
15 **submitted (\$451,298) and up to \$420,000 of the request for the right-of-way**
16 **with the understanding that if the COG does not fund the remainder, Hyde**
17 **Park City could come back to the CMPO and request more funds and was**
18 **seconded by Mayor Peterson. The vote in favor was 12-1.**

20 **#9 Public Hearing – CMPO FY 2027 Budget**
