- (iii) outlines the procedures and timelines for issuing a notice of compulsory education for students in grades 1 through 6 consistent with Section 53G-6-202;
- (iv) outlines the procedures and timelines for issuing a notice of truancy for students in grades 7 through 12 consistent with Section 53G-6-203; and
- (v) establishes that for students in grades 7 through 12, an LEA may enter an incident report of habitual truancy into the Utah Transcript and Record Exchange (UTREx) system after a student accumulates 20 truanies, provided the LEA has issued a notice of truancy in alignment with state law and LEA policy.

(b) The background check requirement described in Subsection (6)(a) applies to any accompanying individual who is 18 years of age or older and is not a student currently enrolled in the LEA.”

WITHDRAWN WITHOUT OBJECTION MOTION TO AMEND THE AMENDMENT was made by Member Boggess and seconded by Member Green that the Board insert “who is not enrolled in or employed by an LEA” as follows:

“(6)(a) A coach or designated school leader may not permit an additional adult or guest who is not enrolled in or employed by an LEA to travel with, lodge with, or accompany the team or student group during a school-sponsored activity unless the individual has successfully passed a criminal background check and ongoing monitoring through the employing LEA consistent with Section 53G-11-402.

MOTION TO AMEND THE AMENDMENT was made by Member Boggess and seconded by Member Green that the Board strike “or accompany” and strike “with” after travel.

“(6)(a) A coach or designated school leader may not permit an additional adult or guest to travel ~~with, lodge with, or accompany~~ the team.....

- (ii) specially designed instruction is provided in addition to, not instead of, high-quality core instruction as consistent with IDEA;
