Proposed Tax Increase

- Additional Ad Valorem Tax Revenue - \$2,475,138
- Increase on an average residence of \$1,222,000 is \$535.66/year and a business \$973.94/year

Without Tax Increase

- Road funding will be decreased
- Transportation utility fee will be implemented
- Municipal energy tax will continue
- Staffing options will be limited
- Stormwater study will be delayed
- Responses to requests will be slower
- Grant matching funds will be limited

Looking Beyond the Tax Rate

- Sales tax revenues vary by community
- Differences in property values and tax base
- Different services are funded by each city
- Growth, infrastructure, and debt needs differ
- Tax rates alone do not reflect service levels
- A lower tax rate does not always mean a lower tax burden
- A very low starting rate can make percentage increases appear large
