Topic 1: Call Meeting to Order (5:01p.m)

Topic 2: Public Comment: Any Items Not on the Agenda

No public comment.

Topic 3: Approve Minutes from the May meeting

Phil motioned to approve the June meeting's minutes, seconded by Jess. Motion passed unanimously.

Topic 4: Staff and Board Communications

The Board and Staff went around the room for introductions and shared their roles. New Board members Ariel and Alexandra were welcomed. Tori attended the June meeting and will be out for the August meeting.

The Board formed a subcommittee to work on the Percent for Arts Policy and provide additional comments to help strengthen it. The subcommittee has drafted redlines, and the next step is to review them with the City Attorney's Office (CAO) for feedback. The policy may come back to the August meeting for further discussion. Once it returns to the Board, the Board will discuss and move forward with a recommendation to City Council. Alexandra mentioned that in San Francisco, the Public Art Board receives 1% of impact fees. Kara added that the subcommittee is looking at what other communities, including Ogden City, are doing and keeping an eye on the outcomes of their programs.

The Board then discussed the FY26 expenditure recap. Kara requested to see the Percent for Arts line items, pool fencing at the MARC, and the Community Center Playground Design. Stephanie will work with the Recreation team to get those details.

Jenny reminded new Board members about the August 11 Board Orientation, which will help bring them up to speed on PAAB processes, goals, and initiatives.

Jocelyn shared an Arts Council update, including the Summit County Fair in Coalville from August 1–8. The Arts Council partners with the Fair to produce the annual Fine Arts Exhibit, which showcases local adult and youth artists and includes judging, awards, and a permanent public art selection by the Summit County Council. Jocelyn also shared upcoming Gallery Strolls on Friday and a Gallery Live event on Main Street, as well as Art on the Trails on August 22, featuring live performances and site-specific artwork along the McLeod Creek Trail. Guided tours depart from Copper Moose Farm Stand, with food and refreshments following. The event runs from 2–6 PM and is \$25 for adults, with free admission for children 12 and under. The Kimball Arts Festival will run August 7–9.

Jenny shared an update from the Summit County Public Art Advisory Board (SCPAAB). An RFP was released for an art project at the new Silver Summit Services Building for seven artistic fences. The SCPAAB received three proposals and plans to re-release the RFP with minor changes to the scope. This is a Percent for Arts project. The County is also developing an RFP for the PEAK (Public Engagement at Kimball) building at Kimball Junction, which will be released once development is further along.

Another RFP will be released for Art for All Pianos and is currently waiting to be released. Two locations will include Newpark and Henefer, which will bring public art opportunities to different communities throughout Summit County. The latest artwork the SCPAAB has worked on is “Quilted Together,” located on the Rail Trail. The County’s long-term goal is to fully transform the Historic Union Pacific Rail Trail into a cohesive 28–30-mile arts, culture, recreation, and tourism corridor.

Loosey the Moose on Swede Alley will be getting a facelift. The platform Loosey stands on needs maintenance, along with some paint touch-ups. Bailey suggested making this a fun community engagement opportunity by documenting Loosey getting a new touch of lipstick. Stephanie will follow up with the Communications team.

Topic 5: Project Updates/No discussion

- New signage being developed for Bus Shelters Phase I and Creekside Shade Structure.
- Loosey the Moose repair complete.
- Bus Shelter Artwork Phase II was approved by Council on June 25th. Staff is working on artist contracts.
- Artful Bike Racks are tentatively scheduled for installation in September.
- Bus Shelter Artwork “Art Kids” deaccession has been completed.
- Artwork re-site: “Waves, Planes, and Parallels” is in progress. Staff are working with multiple City departments to find a future home for the artwork.

Topic 6: Project Updates For Discussion

Trail Artwork RFP: Jenny asked the Board to start thinking about a theme for the Trail Artwork at the Farm Trailhead. Ideas could focus on wildlife, history, connections, etc. The Board was encouraged to consider the existing artwork nearby, including the tunnels, wrapped utility boxes, and the “Making Tracks” Olympic piece.

The Board will do a site visit to get a feel for the area and bring back theme ideas for discussion. Staff will also connect with the Trails team to gather ideas and explore potential collaboration.

Phil motioned to adjourn the meeting, and Bailey seconded. All were in favor.

Mission & History

In 1999, the Arts Council of Park City & Summit County created the first Art in Public Places plan. Subsequently, in 2003, following the 2002 Winter Olympics, Park City Council created the Park City Public Art Board and the first Percent for Arts Policy.

The Public Art Advisory Board's mission is to enrich and connect the Park City community through visual art in public places. The PAAB makes recommendations to the City Council regarding public art placement and expenditures and establishes future funding opportunities for public art.

The board is comprised of Park City residents dedicated to enriching and connecting the Park City community through visual art in public spaces. Community insights are essential to our success as we work to inspire a vibrant, engaged community that celebrates Park City's rich history, culture, and environment.

Program & Project Management

The Arts Council of Park City & Summit County manages the Park City Public Art Program on behalf of Park City Municipal under a three year professional services agreement. Responsibilities include:

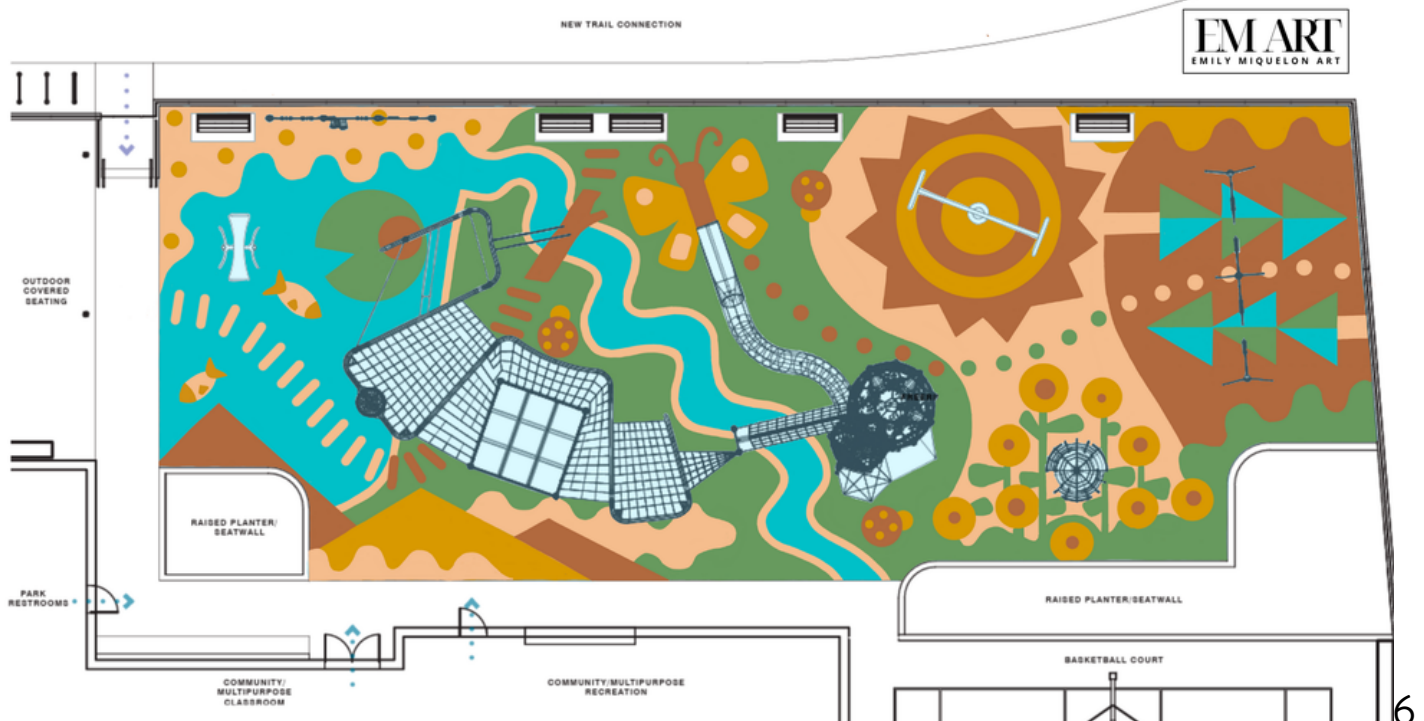

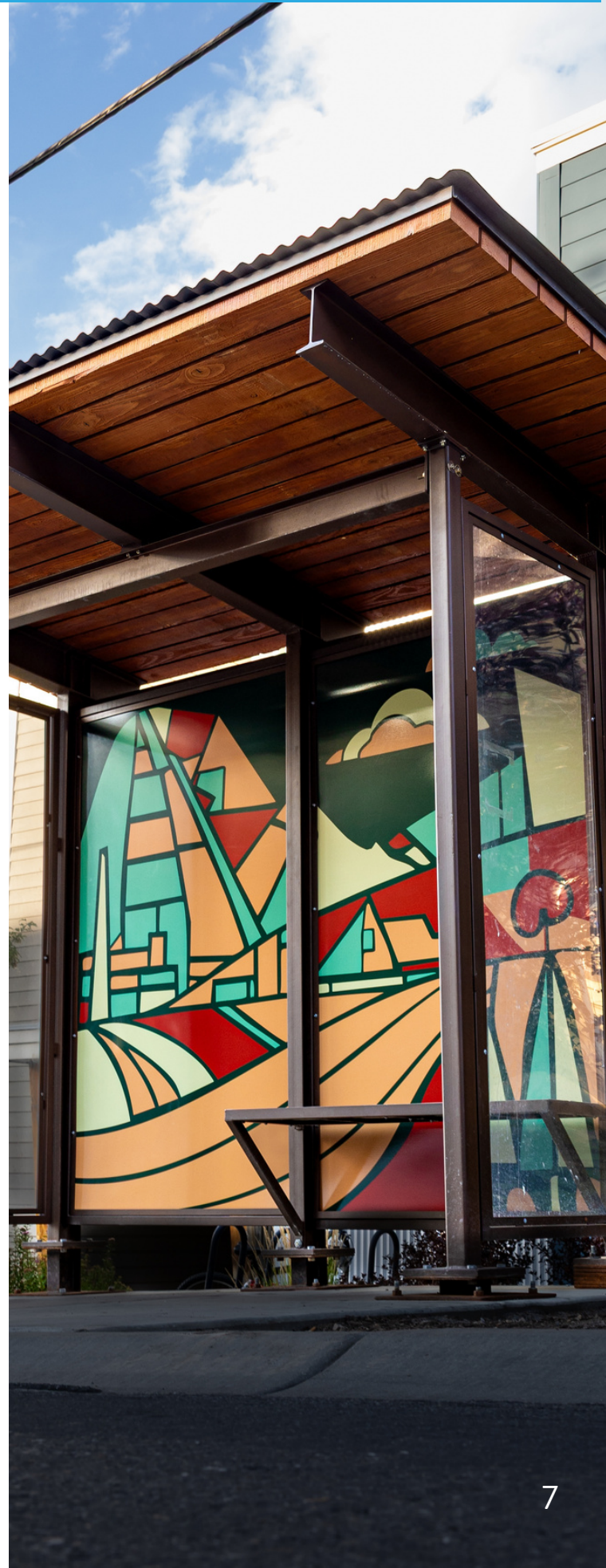
