Reporting Requirements and Resource Valuation Model for Rocky Mountain Power's Community Clean Energy Program	<u>DOCKET NO. 26-035-38</u> <u>NOTICE OF DOCKET AND SCHEDULING CONFERENCE</u>
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ISSUED: August 25, 2026

On March 4, 2026, the Public Service Commission (PSC) issued an Order Approving Program with Modifications ("Order")¹ in a prior docket Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) initiated to obtain the PSC's approval of a community clean energy program ("Program") under the Community Renewable Energy Act.² With certain modifications, the Order approved RMP's Program.

In the Order, the PSC concluded "annual reporting will be necessary for stakeholders to review the Program's actual performance and evaluate whether the Program is shifting cost[s] or benefits to non-participating customers."³ Noting the Division of Public Utilities had recommended the PSC convene a workgroup to develop an annual reporting template and other parties had expressed a willingness to participate in such a workgroup, the PSC indicated it would issue a separate notice that establishes a workgroup and sets the matter for a scheduling conference.

The PSC also “strongly encourage[d] the parties to collaborate on developing a Resource Valuation model”⁴ and suggested “the workgroup established to develop annual reporting requirements may provide a useful forum to explore that issue and to facilitate informal information sharing.”⁵ Consequently, the PSC indicated it would ask stakeholders to come to the first scheduling conference in the new docket prepared to discuss whether Resource Valuation issues should be included in the scope of the proceeding.

Accordingly, the PSC gives notice it will conduct a virtual scheduling conference in this docket on **Tuesday, September 8, 2026, at 3:00 p.m.** Parties should come prepared to discuss a process and schedule for establishing the Program’s annual reporting requirements and whether the scope of this docket should include the PSC’s adoption of a Resource Valuation methodology or resolve other outstanding issues related to Resource Valuation.
