Recommendation memo

Mayor and City Council,

Public Works has received 3 bids for fencing and gates for the pumphouse. Currently there are areas around the pumphouse and water tank that are not secure because of no fencing in those areas. With continued security issues around water tanks and water system the public works is requesting to have fencing installed in those areas.

The recommendation to stay within the budget is to install a 6' chain link fence including a 12' double gate for a second access to the pumphouse and a 20' cantilever gate at the main entrance that a future automatic opener can be attached to.

Bids:

Custom Fence:	\$16,263.00 without operator \$32,606.00 with operator
Watts Fencing	\$17,444.00 without operator \$28,944.00 with operator
Utah Fence Warehouse	\$17,169.00 without operator \$30,199.82 with operator

We could install the operator at this time with the \$40,000 in savings the city on the cost of the new SCADA system.
