 - a. In deciding whether the material is harmful to minors the committee must consider whether the material contains a description or representation of nudity, sexual conduct, sexual excitement, sadomasochistic abuse, sexual conduct with an animal, or animal crushing that:
 - i. taken as a whole, appeals to the prurient interest in sex of minors;
 - ii. is patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult community as a whole with respect to what is suitable material for minors; and
 - iii. does not have serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value for minors.

 - b. In deciding whether material is harmful to minors, the committee may also consider whether the other criteria found to be harmful to minors, such as violence, pervasive vulgarity, animal abuse, or self-harm.

 - c. In deciding whether the material is pornographic, the committee must consider whether the material:
 - i. when applying contemporary community standards, the material, taken as a whole, appeals to prurient interests in sex;
 - ii. the material is patently offensive in the description or depiction of nudity, sexual conduct, sexual excitement, sadomasochistic abuse, or excretion; and
 - iii. taken as a whole the material or performance does not have serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value.

 - ~~a. May consider other criteria found to be harmful to minors, such as violence, pervasive vulgarity, animal abuse as referenced in Section 76-5c-101 or self-harm.~~
