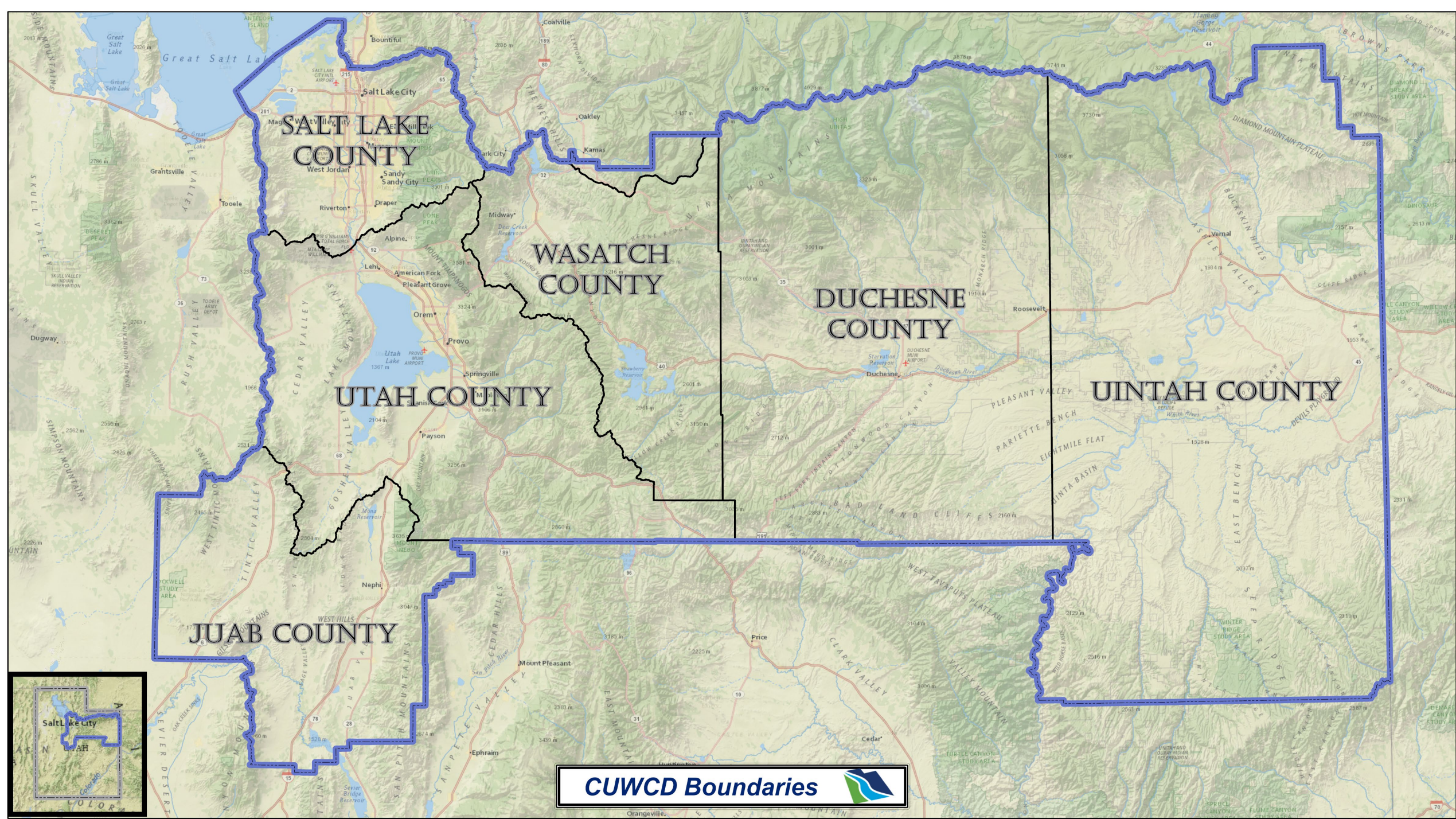

This map illustrates the extensive water infrastructure managed by CUWCD in Utah, as of August 2026. The map features a variety of water bodies and infrastructure projects, color-coded to represent different types of facilities and flow directions.

Key Infrastructure Systems and Reservoirs:

- Jordanelle Reservoir:** Located in the north-central region, it is a major water source. Infrastructure includes the Jordanelle Dam & Hydro, Timpanogos Canal, and Wasatch Canal.
- Upper Stillwater Reservoir:** Situated in the northeast, it feeds into the Strawberry Aqueduct & Collection System. Key features include the Upper Stillwater Dam, Docs Diversion, Stillwater Tunnel, North Fork Siphon, Hades Diversion, Win Diversion, Rhodes Diversion, Rhodes Tunnel, West Fork Pipeline, and Vat Diversion.
- Strawberry Reservoir:** Located in the central-eastern part of the state, it is a critical component of the Strawberry Aqueduct & Collection System. Infrastructure includes the Currant Creek Dam, Currant Tunnel, Layout Tunnel, Water Hollow Tunnel, and Open Channel #2.
- Starvation Reservoir:** Situated in the southeast, it is part of the Starvation Collection System. Key features include the Starvation Dam, DVWTP, and the Duchesne Aqueduct.
- Utah Lake System:** The largest body of water on the map, it is the central hub for the Utah Lake System. Infrastructure includes the North Shore Terminal Reservoir, North Shore Segment, Pony Express Pump Station, Alpine Aqueduct 3, DACRWTP, Groundwater Polishing Plant, 800 North Segment, Olmsted Bifurcation Reservoir, Olmsted Diversion, Olmsted Flowline, Olmsted Hydro, Spanish Fork Provo Reservoir Canal Pipeline, Spanish Fork Santaquin Pipeline, Spanish Fork Canyon Pipeline, and the Spanish Fork Regulating Reservoir.
- Diamond Fork System:** Located in the south-central region, it includes the Diamond Fork Pipeline, Upper Diamond Fork Pipeline, Upper Diamond Fork Tunnel, Monks Overflow Control Structure, Tanner Ridge Tunnel, and the Sixth Water Aqueduct.
- WCWEP (Wasatch-Cedar Water Enhancement Project):** A major project in the north-central region, it includes the Daniel-Hubert Canal, Daniel Creek, and the West Fork Pipeline.
- M&I System (Mineral and Irrigation):** Located in the north-central region, it includes the North Branch Pipeline and the Alpine Aqueduct 3.
- CWP (Cedar Breaks Water Project):** Located in the north-central region, it includes the North Shore Terminal Reservoir and the Pony Express Pump Station.

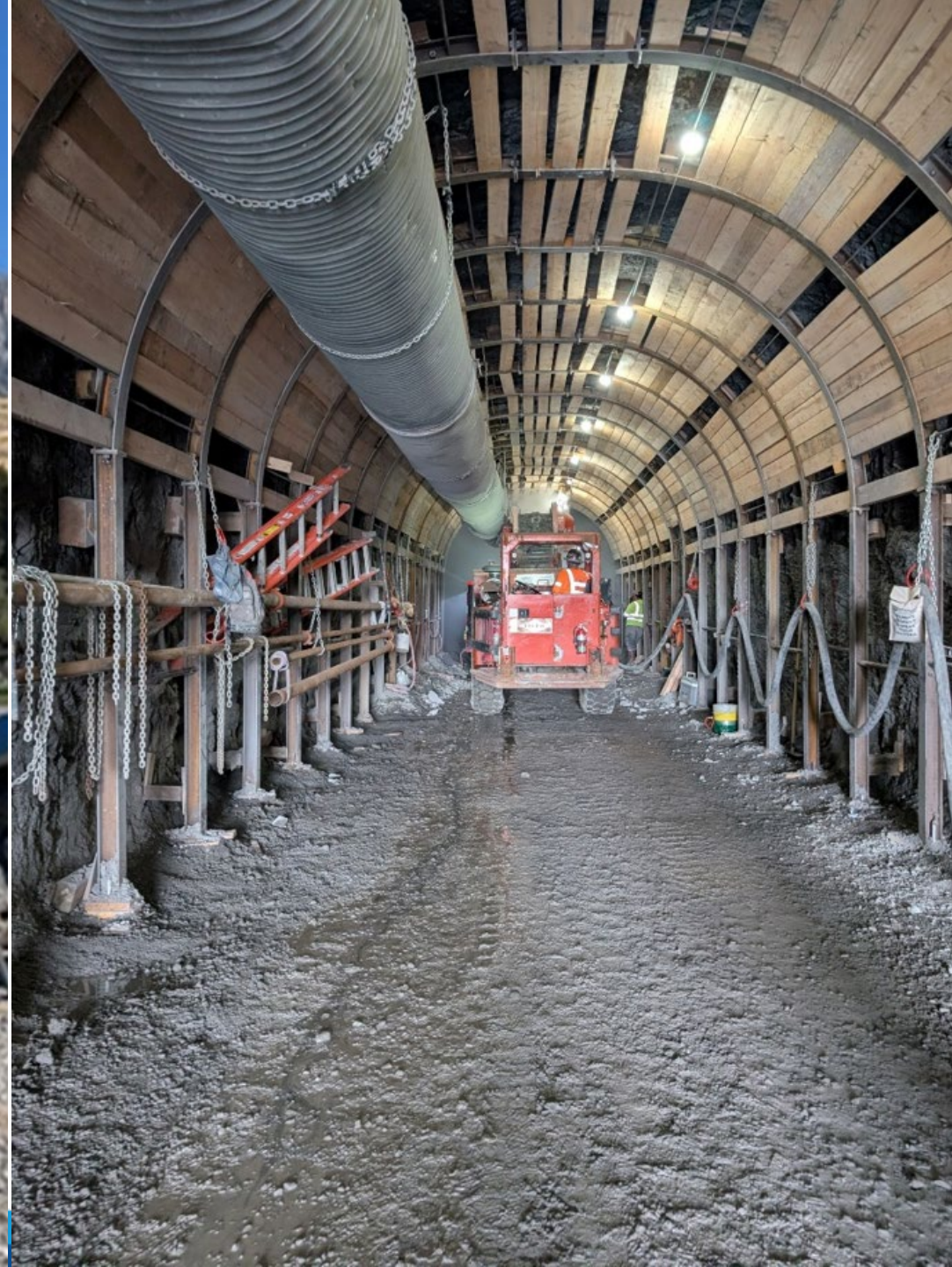

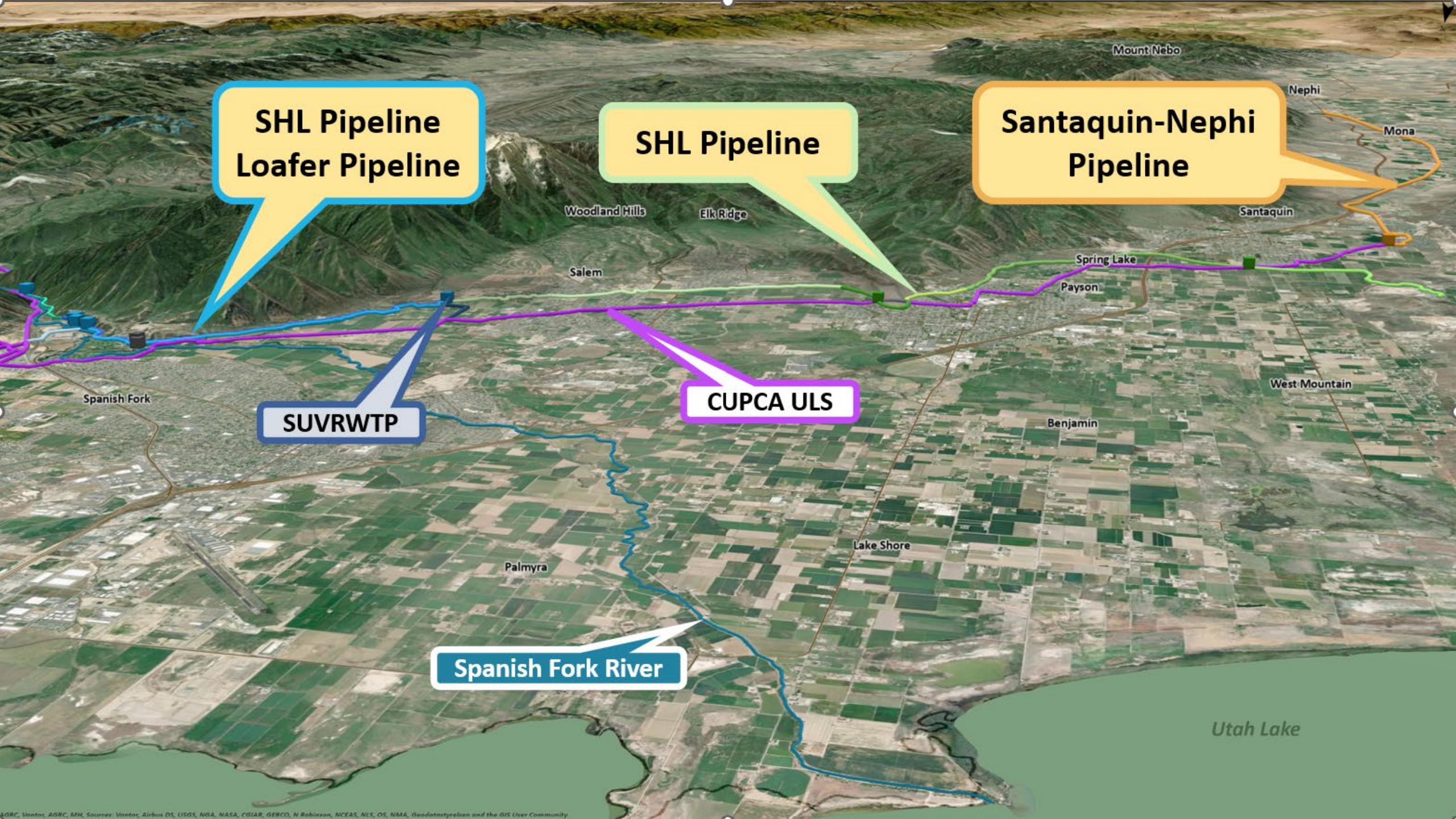

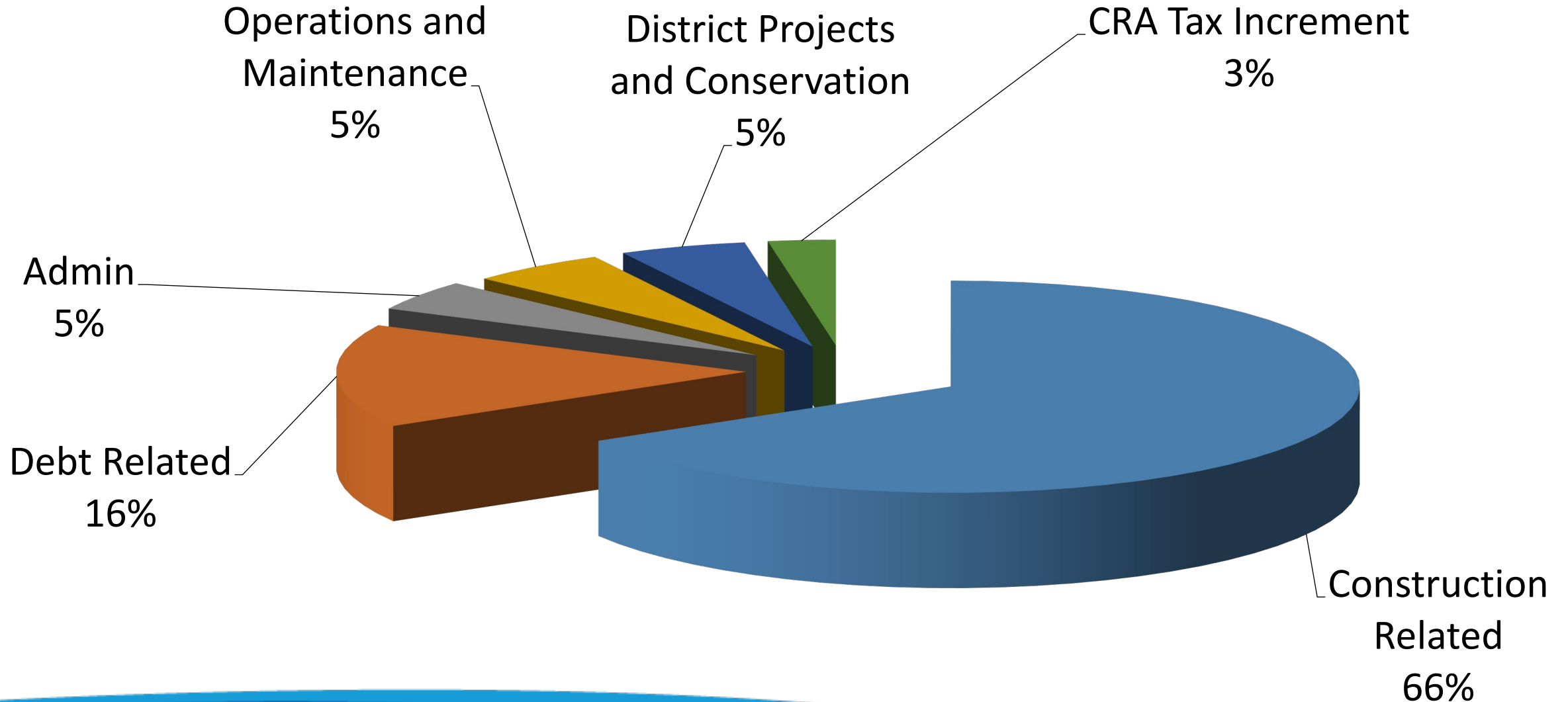

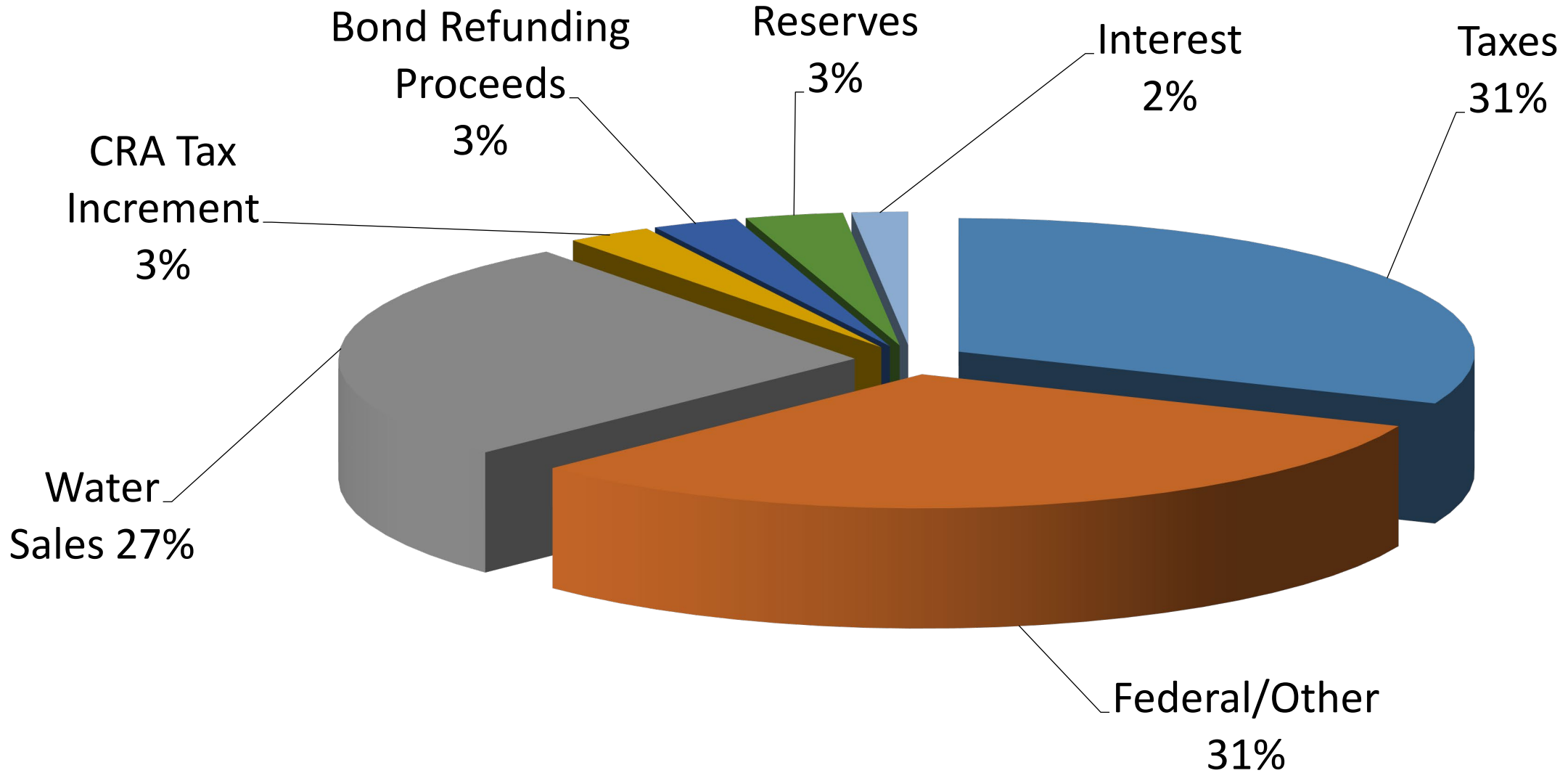

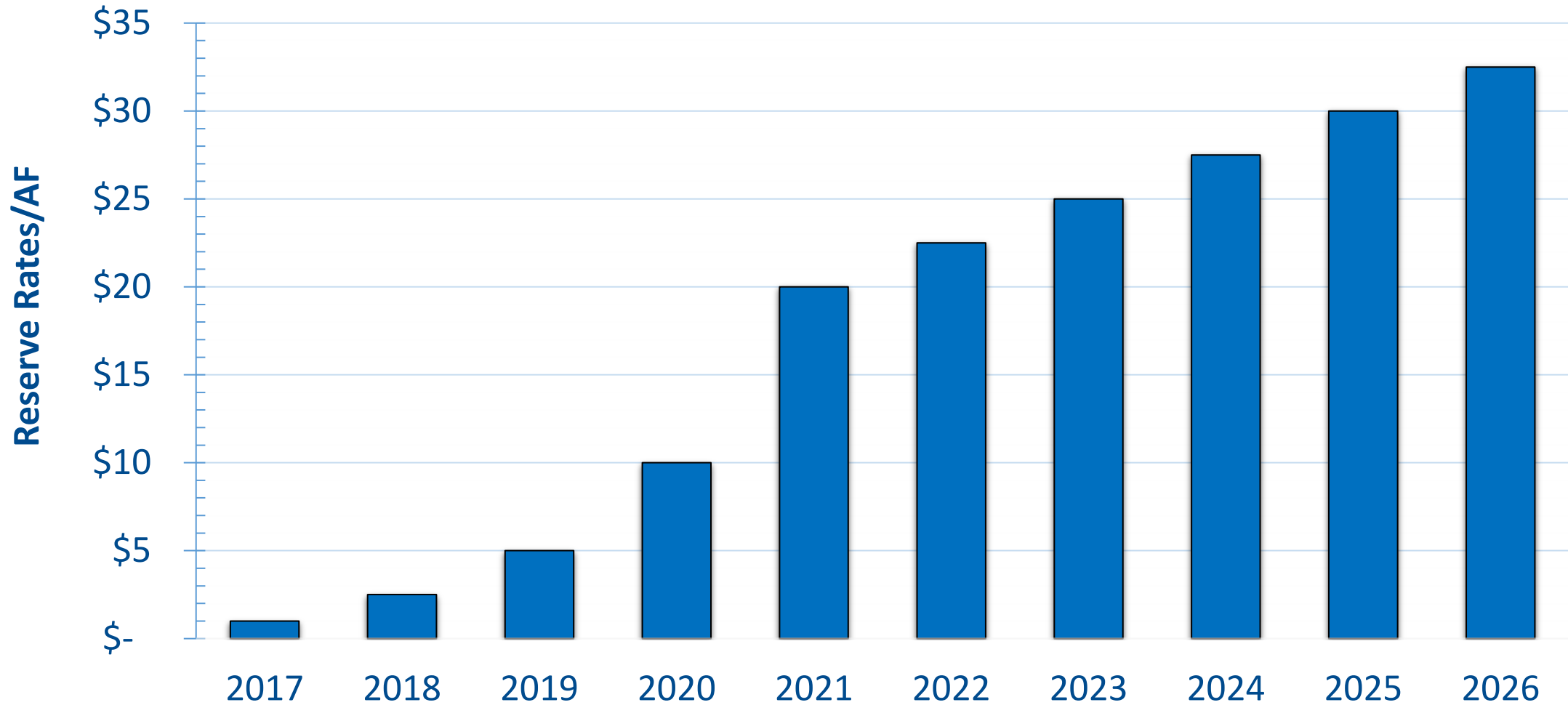
FY 2026-2027 Budgeted Expenditures



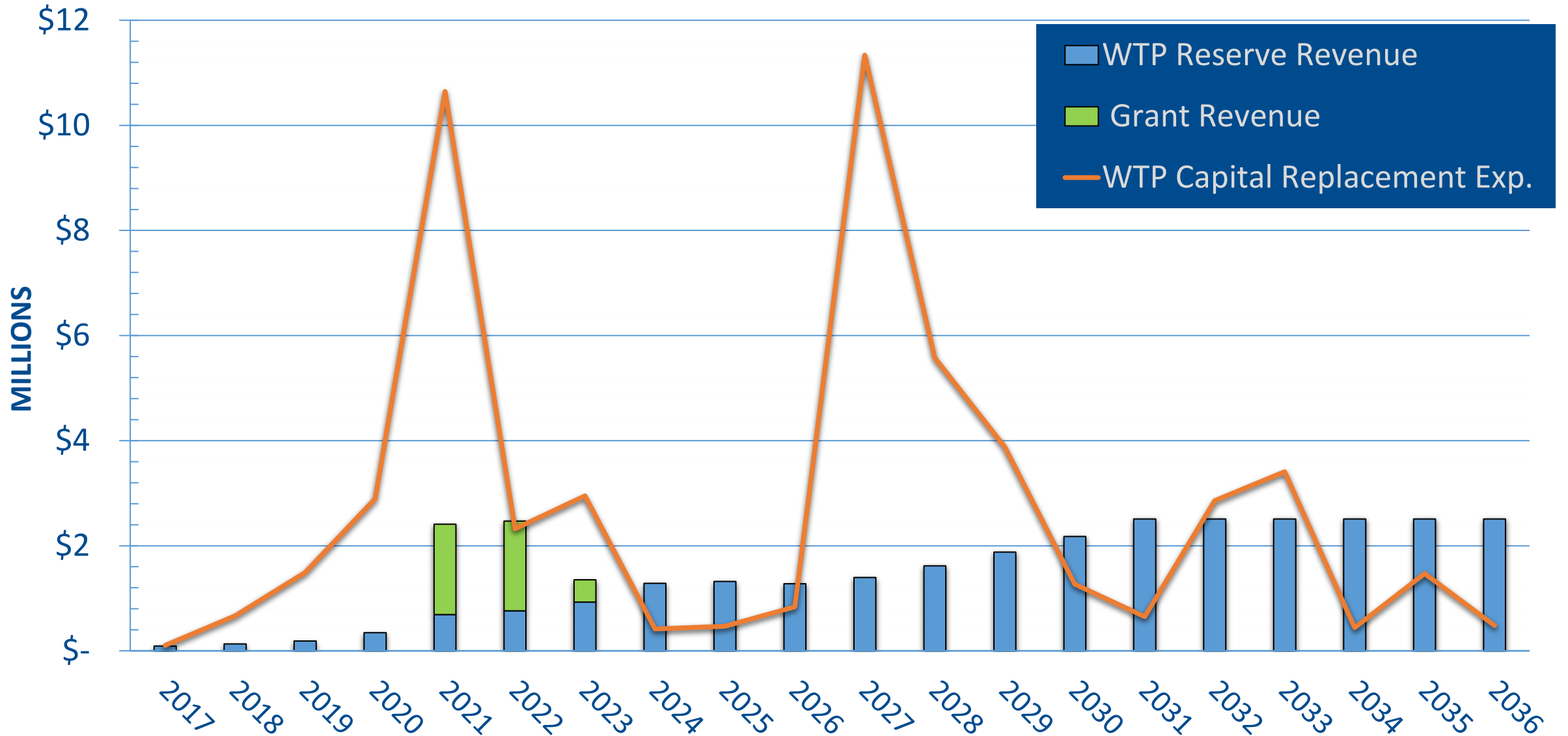
FY 2026-2027 Projected Revenues



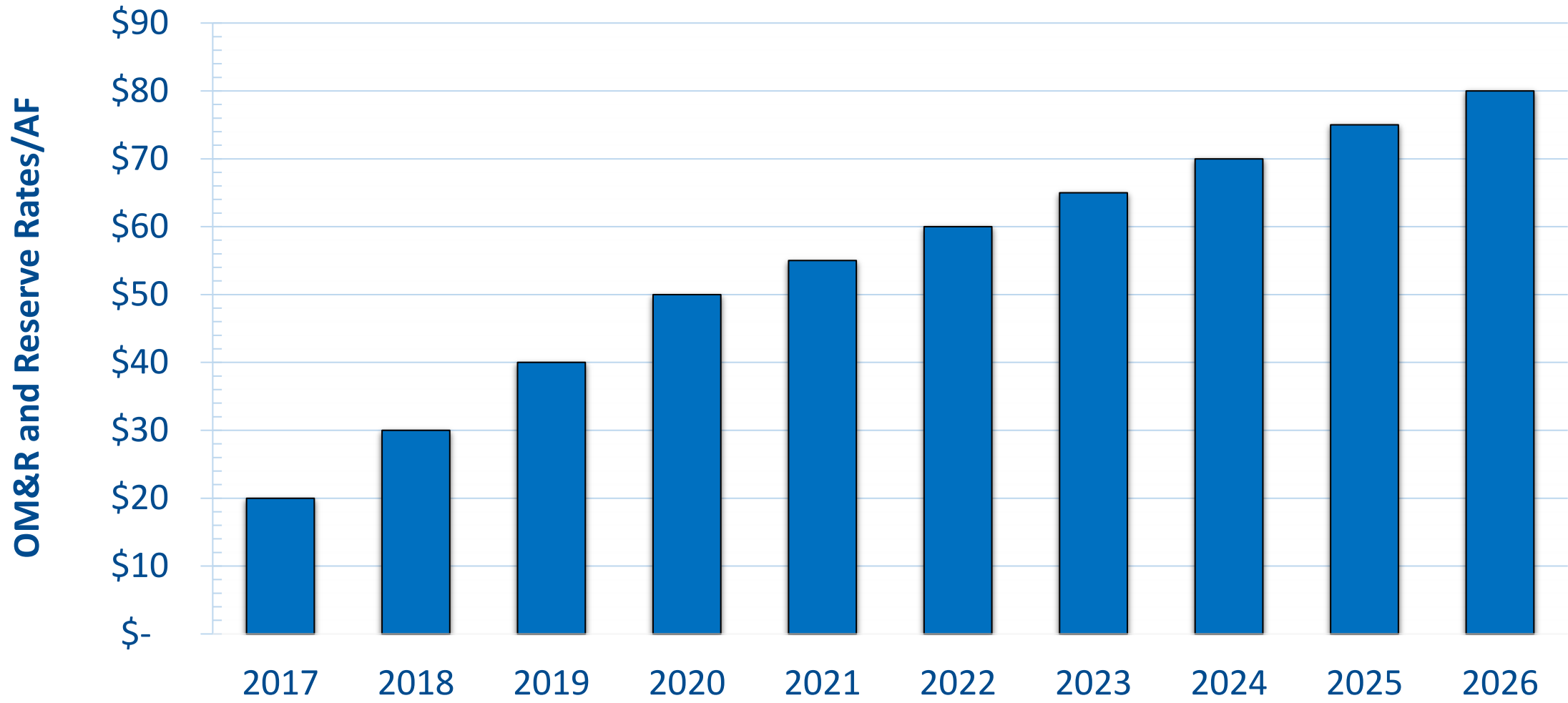

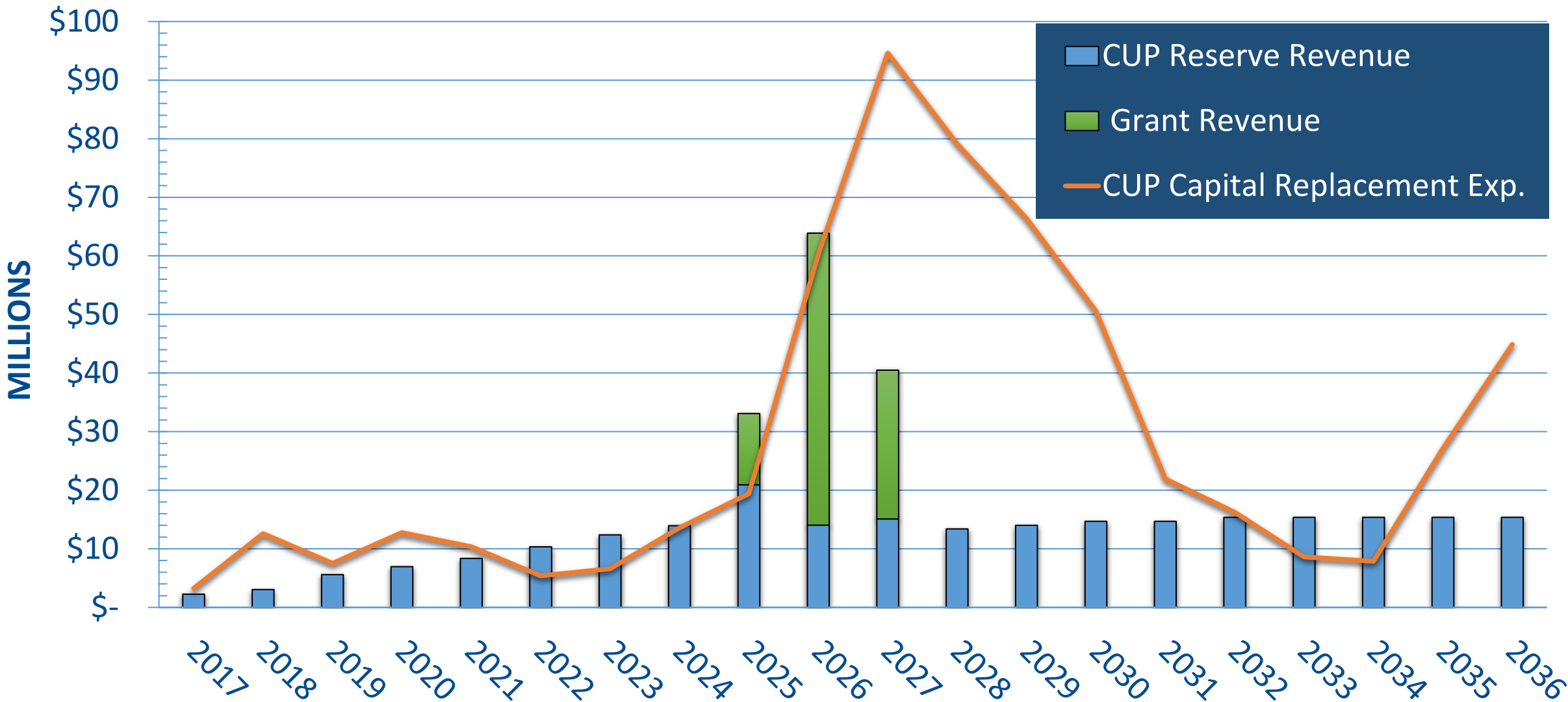

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED TAX INCREASE
CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT
IN DUCHESNE COUNTY**

The CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT is proposing to increase its property tax revenue.

The CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT tax on a \$325,000 residence would increase from \$70.43 to \$71.50, which is \$1.07 per year.

The CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT tax on a \$325,000 business would increase from \$128.05 to \$130.00, which is \$1.95 per year.

If the proposed budget is approved, CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT would receive an additional \$26,642 in property tax revenue per year as a result of the tax increase. If the proposed budget is approved, CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT would increase its property tax budgeted revenue by -2.59% above last year's property tax budgeted revenue excluding eligible new growth.

The CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT invites all concerned citizens to a public hearing for the purpose of hearing comments regarding the proposed tax increase and to explain the reasons for the proposed tax increase. The CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT is proposing to increase its property tax revenue.

The CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT tax on a \$360,000 residence would increase from \$78.01 to \$79.20, which is \$1.19 per year.

The CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT tax on a \$360,000 business would increase from \$141.84 to \$144.00, which is \$2.16 per year.

If the proposed budget is approved, CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT would receive an additional \$36,579 in property tax revenue per year as a result of the tax increase. If the proposed budget is approved, CENTRAL UTAH WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT would increase its property tax budgeted revenue by -4.46% above last year's property tax budgeted revenue excluding eligible new growth.
