- I. Meeting Called to Order: Eric Kerns**
 - a. The meeting was called to order at 7:05pm.
- II. Pledge of Allegiance: By Invitation.**
- III. Attendance: Cathye Huckaby.**
 - a. Board Members' Present: Ryan Frisby, Vice Chairperson; Eric Kerns, Member; Tim Beam, Member; Cathye Huckaby, Board Clerk/Office Manager.
 - b. Board Members Absent: Pat Fleckenstin, Chairperson.
 - c. Harmony Valley Fire Department: Fire Captain Jim Banks.
 - d. Fire Association: Tamra Banks, Member.
 - e. Community: Cole Newbold.
- IV. Reading and Approval of Previous ACB Meeting Minutes: Ryan Frisby.**
 - a. May 20, 2026, Administrative Control Board (ACB) meeting minutes were emailed to each member prior to the meeting. Members had a chance to review the minutes and make changes. No changes were requested (See Attached).

Motion: Ryan Frisby made a motion that the ACB Meeting Minutes for May 20, 2026, be approved as reviewed. Tim Beam second the motion. Motion carried unanimously by all present.
- V. Financial Report: Cathye Huckaby.**
 - a. NHVSSD Balance Sheet dated 6-17-2026 was reviewed (See Attached).
 - b. NHVSSD Budgets vs Actuals FY 2026 January – December 2026, as of 6-17-2026 was reviewed (See Attached).
 - c. NHVSSD Expense Report from 5-1-2026 to 6-17-2026 was reviewed (See Attached).
 - d. The general fund balance has decreased significantly, partly due to a \$33,240 payment for an air compressor on June 11. The fire association provided a \$20,000 reimbursement for this purchase.

- e. The budget line-items are approaching 100% in some areas, necessitating a mid-year budget review.
- f. Contracted services are at 90% of the line-item budget with one payment remaining.
- g. Total operations are at 97.88% of the line-item budget, and funds will need to be moved into this account.
- h. The chief and clerk will meet to review the budget and potentially move funds from contingency to cover expenses to the end of the year.
- i. The certified budget for 2026 is \$171,372, based on the current mill rate of .000439. This does not include the proposed tax increase.

Motion: Tim Beam made a motion to accept the financial report as reviewed and discussed. Ryan Frisby second the motion. Motion carried unanimously by all present

VI. Truth in Taxation (TNT) Update: Pat Fleckenstein.

- a. Preparations are underway for a proposed tax increase.
- b. Pat Fleckenstein is coordinating with a printing company for the postcard notices, which previously cost around \$500 to \$1,600.
- c. The team has reached out to the Tax Commission and the county to confirm timelines and notification requirements.
- d. The county is reportedly "behind the eight ball" on their calendar, but the district is well ahead in its preparations.
- e. The board discussed that the goal is to raise the budget by approximately \$80,000, which will establish a new mill rate. The current maximum mill rate is .008.

VII. EMR Licensing Project: Chief Banks.

- a. Three members (Chief Banks, John Ray, and a new student named Andrew Porter) completed an 8-week condensed EMT training course.
- b. They now need to pass the National Registry test to finalize their state

VIII. Board Member's Report:

- a. No additional Reporting.

IX. Fire Chief's Report: Jim Banks.

- a. Recent incidents include assisting with a fire at the Snowfield exit and a search and rescue in Kolob Canyon.
- b. The Snowfield fire was determined to be human caused but not arson, likely from sparks from a vehicle.
- c. The department currently has 16 personnel, with an optimal target of 20.
- d. Recent interest has come from fire science students from Cedar City.
- e. The chief's 19-year-old truck has been in repair for two months. This highlights the need for an apparatus replacement plan.

- f. The chief's long-term goal is to have one or two paid staff members on duty during the day during the fire season (Memorial Day to Labor Day) to improve response times.

X. Office Manager/Board Clerk Report: Cathye Huckaby.

- a. Chairman Pat Fleckenstein and Vice Chairman Ryan Grisby signed the AUP agreement with the district's accountants for filing annual financial reports due before June 30th.
- b. A corrective action plan was noted for a missed training requirement in 2025; all board members must complete the required state auditor's office training for 2026.
- c. The Utah State Commission property tax division forms were filed electronically before the June 22 deadline by Cathye Huckaby.
- d. A notice for a fire board vacancy has been posted. The filing deadline is June 28. Cole Newbold attended the meeting to learn more about the position.

XI. Fire Association Reports: Tamra Banks.

- a. Apple Fest vendor revenue model is undecided, including whether to charge a flat fee, a percentage of gross sales, or a hybrid, and how to ensure accurate sales reporting.
- b. Financial impact of replacing in-house food sales with food trucks is unclear; comparative revenue analysis is needed.
- c. The persistent litter at Exit 36 remains an issue despite state cleanup efforts, indicating a recurring problem that may require additional strategies.

XII. Community Remarks:

- a. Cole Newbold is interested in joining the Fire Board and will be submitting an application.

XIII. Meeting Adjourned: Pat Fleckenstein.

- a. Meeting Adjourned at 7:38pm.

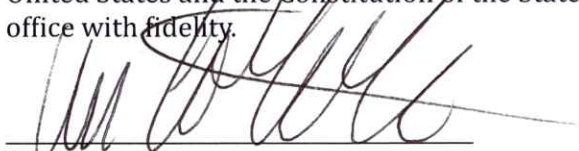

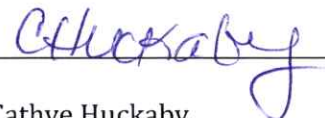

- Insurance Service Office

- Rates community fire protection for fire risk and insurance (PPC)

Public Protection Classification (PPC) Program

- Applies to communities (towns, cities) throughout US
- PPC from Class 1 (best) to Class 10 (worst) *SLC, LA, SF, Chicago, NY, Boston ... Class 1*
- Class affects homeowners' insurance premiums
- ISO typically conducts PPC surveys every 5 years
- Last visit to New Harmony 2022
- Next visit anticipated in 2027

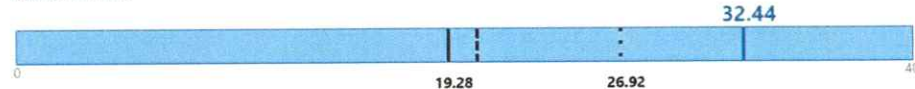

- Class 5 is decent and every reason to be proud of ...
- ... but we do not want slip to Class 6
- Improvements since 2022: Fire flow testing, training ...
- These will likely increase Water Supply and Fire Department points and move us into the mid-50s
- Likelihood of keeping Class 5/5X: Very Good



Can We Achieve Class 4?

- How much will our insurance premiums go down?
- As insurers pay increasingly more for wildland fire damage, the pool of insurers is shrinking
- Less insurers = skyrocketing premiums
- Lower PPC may entice more insurers to write policies in our area
- More insurers = competition
- Better status and reputation
- Insurer competition = best chance of keeping premiums as low as possible
- We want to make our risk as attractive to insurers as possible
- Better PPC may improve success for federal, state and private grants

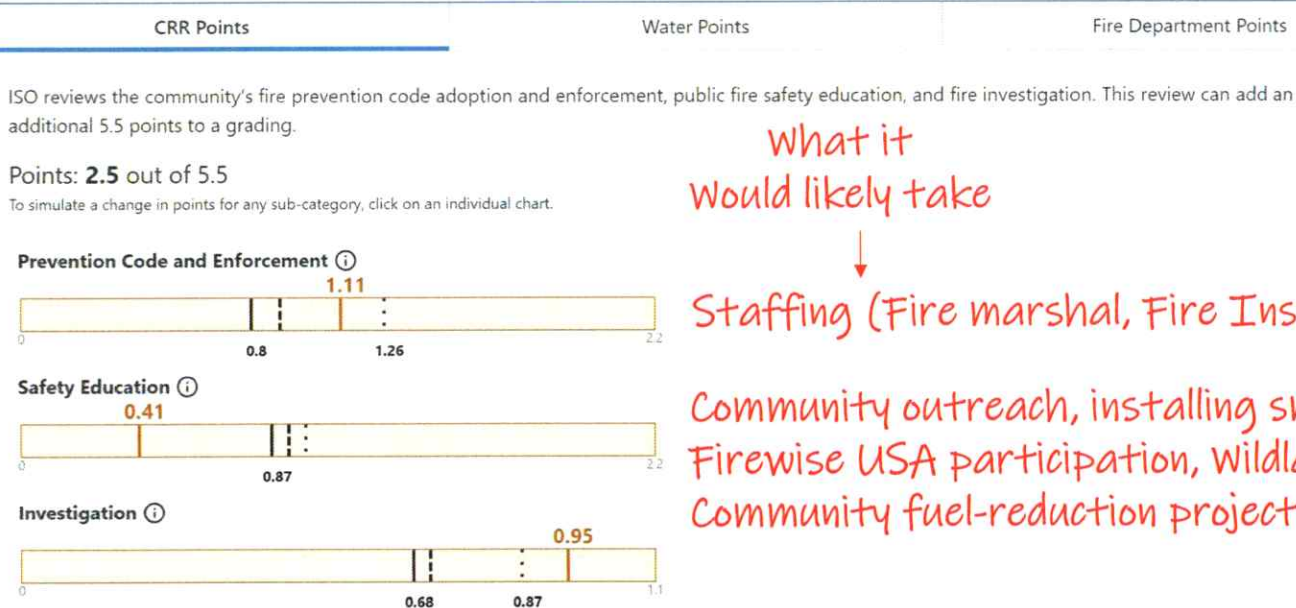

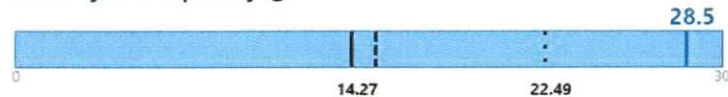

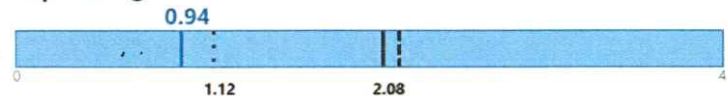

ISO focuses on a community's fire suppression capabilities by measuring the fire department's first-alarm response and initial attack to minimize potential loss. ISO reviews such items as engine companies, ladder or service companies, reserve apparatus, pumping capacity, equipment carried on apparatus, deployment of fire companies, company personnel, training, and operational considerations.

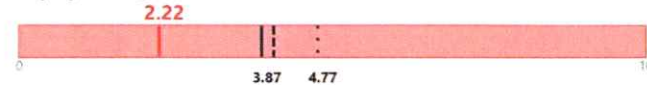

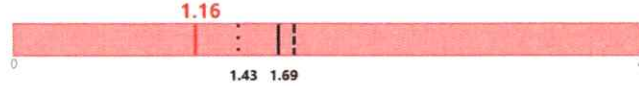
