RESOLUTION NO. 04-15-2026-I

**A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR A BALLOT PROPOSITION FOR THE IMPOSITION
OF A LOCAL OPTION SALES AND USE TAX FOR FUNDING PARKS, ARTS,
RECREATION, AND CULTURAL FACILITIES**

WHEREAS, Payson City (“City”) is a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of Utah; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Utah Code § 59-12-1402, a county option sales and use tax of up to one-tenth of one percent (0.1%) may be submitted to the voters for approval to fund parks, recreation, arts, and cultural facilities and organizations; and

WHEREAS, the Payson City Council finds that additional funding is necessary to support and enhance parks, recreational opportunities, arts programs, and cultural facilities within the community; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to submit to the qualified electors of Payson City a proposition to approve the imposition of such tax.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAYSON CITY COUNCIL:

1. Ballot Proposition. The following proposition shall be submitted to the qualified electors of Payson City at the municipal general election to be held on November 3, 2026:

“Shall Payson City enact a local sales and use tax of 1/10 of 1% (1 cent for every \$10.00 spent) for a period of ten (10) years to fund recreational amenities and cultural arts facilities and organizations within Payson City. Revenue from this tax may be used to support non-profit organizations that provide programs including, but not limited to, live theater, choral groups, bands, festivals, and youth arts and theater programs. Revenue may also be used for capital improvements to publicly owned or operated amenities, including but not limited to parks, playing fields, trails, bike paths, a performing arts center, museums, and pool enclosure.”

2. Authorization of Election. The City Recorder is hereby directed to coordinate with the Utah County Clerk to place the proposition on the ballot for the November 2026 election.

3. Notice.

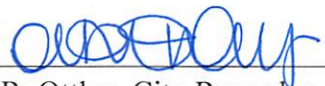
The City Recorder is authorized and directed to provide all required notices of the election in accordance with applicable law.
