 - In July - Part-time Graffiti Code Enforcement Officer position became full-time

2012 CODE ENFORCEMENT

- Utility Box Art Project underway; 5 city boxes wrapped.



2013 CODE ENFORCEMENT

- Code Cases - 2,315
- Graffiti Cases - 970
- Vacant Building Ordinance yielded 6 demolitions, 3 rehabilitations, 2 landscape abatements, and 1 new roof
- Assisted County Health Department with several transient camp-site clean-ups
- Initiated Salvage Yard Enforcement
- Utility Box Art Program - wrapped 5 boxes
- Conducted I-15/3300 South corridor clean-up project of weeds and debris



2014 CODE ENFORCEMENT

- Staff: 1 Supervisor, 2 Code Enforcement Officers, 1 P/T Graffiti Removal Officer
- Code Cases - 1,130
- Graffiti Cases - 596
- Implemented Mayor's Customer Service Performance Plans & Goals
- Reduced the number of code cases through strengthened code enforcement initiatives and goals while promoting positive image.
- Acquired approval from UDOT to participate in the Utility Box Art Program; wrapped 3 UDOT boxes.

2011 ANIMAL SERVICES

■ May 2011 – December 2011

■ 351 Intakes

- 6 dog bite cases
- 10 animal cruelty cases
- 24 owner surrenders

■ 319 Outcomes

- 62 adoptions
- 71 returned to owners
- 138 released to rescue



■ New shelter software system (May 2011)

■ Remodeled the interior of the shelter

■ New exercise area for the dogs

■ Reached “No Kill” status with *No More Homeless Pets Utah*



2012 ANIMAL SERVICES

■ 2012 Animal intakes/outcomes

■ 505 Intakes

- 16 bites
- 6 animal cruelty
- 34 owner surrenders

■ 498 Outcomes

- 113 adoptions
- 99 returned to owner
- 208 released to rescue

- We had an outbreak of Avian Botulism, over 100 dead ducks were removed from the water ways of SSL
- Landscaping done at the shelter
- Coordinated with the Parks Department to get help with community service workers


■ 2013 Animal Intakes/Outcomes
