1. Call to Order

Mayor Bonner called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

2. General Consent Calendar

- 3. C-2 & C-3 Zones/Ordinance 2015-04** – Discuss a Proposed Ordinance Amending Section 16.5.2 (Permitted and Conditional Uses) of the Municipal Code Regarding the C-2 and C-3 Zones. Recommended without Conditions by the Midway City Planning Commission.

Mayor Bonner explained that the Council needed to decide what it wanted Midway to look like in its commercial zones. Michael Henke added that the General Plan would be reviewed the following year with a survey sent to residents. He noted that the General Plan included a chapter on Main Street.

Note: Paul Berg arrived at 5:05 p.m.

Mr. Henke reviewed a list of permitted and conditional uses in the commercial zones. He noted that the zones included significant numbers of older homes. He thought that the zones were versatile and were not over regulated.

Note: Council Member Kohler arrived at 5:09 p.m.

Council Member Hines stressed that the City needed revenue and should encourage Swiss architecture.

Note: Wes Johnson arrived at 5:12 p.m.

Mayor Bonner suggested that the maximum allowed size for stores be included on the survey for the General Plan. Mr. Henke indicated that the size limitation was per store. He said that would be clarified in the Municipal Code.

Council Member Dodge explained that the commercial area, east of 400 East/River Road, had deep parcels but no access except for Main Street. He pointed out that 100 North would not continue east beyond 400 East. He said that it would be difficult to develop these parcels. He added that they would be a good fit for mixed use development.

Council Member Dodge thought that the proposed density for mixed use development was low. He recommended that it be 20 units per acre like in Heber City. Mr. Henke responded that lenders would not loan money for a project that had more than 20% commercial. Mayor Bonner noted that the City's height restriction would also limit the number of units.

Council Member Dodge questioned prohibiting parking on the front of commercial property. Council Member Van Wagoner agreed that some businesses had to have parking in the front. Mr. Henke responded that having buildings next to the sidewalk created a walkable business district. He did not want Midway to look like Main Street south of 400 South in Heber City.

Council Member Dodge noted that car dealerships had to have parking in front of the business. Paul Berg agreed that businesses wanted parking in the front.

Mayor Bonner thought that the Municipal Code should be flexible but also restrict unwanted uses.

Mr. Berg indicated that the Planning Commission talked about creating another commercial zone.

Mayor Bonner again suggested that the City needed to purchase property along Main Street for public parking.

Council Member Van Wagoner indicated that there could be landscaping between the road and any parking.

Mr. Henke suggested that front parking be prohibited with the City Council being able to allow exceptions. Most of the Council agreed.

Council Member Van Wagoner said that the current commercial regulations were boxing in homes.

Council Member Hines asked why the carwash, proposed several years earlier for the corner of 400 East and Main Street, was not approved. Mr. Henke responded that it would have been noisy and create icy conditions at the intersection.

The Council agreed that art studios should be permitted uses but separated from artwork that required chemicals and metal.

Mr. Henke reported that he received a lot of comments regarding the new mortuary in the City. The Council agreed that mortuaries should be permitted in the C-2 zone and a conditional use in the C-3 zone.

Council Member Van Wagoner asked if storage units should be allowed in the commercial zones. Council Member Dodge thought that they should be permitted somewhere in the City.

Mayor Bonner recommended that "massage therapy clinics" be changed to "massage" and that

day spas be added to the line item.

Council Member Dodge asked if a use was not permitted if it was not on the list. Mr. Henke responded that a similar use might be approved. He said that other uses would not be allowed and that the Municipal Code would have to be amended to include them.

Mr. Henke explained that a city had to allow sexually oriented businesses. He indicated that the area governments had an interlocal agreement to allow them next to the Heber City Airport.

Council Member Kohler asked if cities had to allow smoke shops. Mr. Henke did not know and referred the question to the City Attorney. Mayor Bonner did not want to allow them.

Mr. Henke said that businesses could be handled like alcohol establishments were only a percentage of products could be smoke related.
