

5-Year Plan

Project 1. **Performing Arts Building**

A new 140,000 square foot building costing \$ 42 Million to house the Arts and Music Departments. This building will also have a 600 Seat Theater/ Music Hall and a 250 seat Performance/ Recital Theater. Classrooms, practice facilities, labs, and offices.

Project 2. **Business Building**

The Woodbury School of Business is proposing a 160,000 square foot addition costing an estimated \$40 million. This facility provides additional classrooms, labs, faculty offices and electrical upgrade.

Project 3. **Classroom Building II**

In order to accommodate the continued growth of the institution, the university is proposing the construction of 180,000 square feet of classroom and office space. This building has an estimated cost of \$40 million. This building is part of the current UVU master plan.

Project 4. **Campus Entry/ Administration Building**

This building will create a true campus entry and provide needed offices for campus administration. Located between the Woodbury Business and Browning Building this addition would be the true entry and greeting space for the University.

Land Banking

Payson, Utah

UVU is looking south to Payson, Utah for a land purchase. Located along the Frontrunner track system this land would then be connected to UVUs other campus locations in Utah County. This fast growing community and those in south Utah County will benefit from having higher educational opportunities close to the new population center. No agreements have been made at this time.

Thanksgiving Point Building I

Utah Valley University currently owns 10 acres of property at Thanksgiving Point in Lehi Utah. This site is an excellent site for a satellite campus. UVU plans to construct an 80,000 to 100,000 square foot building that will house classrooms and offices for the growing population of students that attend UVU from the north part of Utah County.
