









Pooled Services- Major Investigations Unit

- On May 2, 2015 MIU assisted Taylorsville DEU in the apprehension of a fugitive case they were working which resulted in the arrest of the fugitive and seizure of two firearms.
- On May 7, 2015 MIU Detectives were in the area of 4700 South Redwood Road when a robbery had just occurred. MIU Detectives assisted with a high risk stop and subsequently booked the vehicle in evidence. The offender was subsequently charged with aggravated robbery and aggravated assault.
- On June 1, 2015 MIU, in conjunction with the USMS, tracked down Moises Hernandez, a federal fugitive to a Taylorsville residence. Hernandez was arrest with out incident.

Pooled Services- Metro Gang Unit

April 2: POCS/Taylorsville

- Detective Morton utilized a CI to have the suspect deliver meth to the Taylorsville area. UPD located and stopped the vehicle. K9 responded and alerted to the presence of narcotics in the car. Two ounces of meth and a half ounce of heroin was recovered.

May 6: Fugitive Arrest

- Sergeant Bell received information that an ESR member was staying at the Callaway Apartments. Sergeant Bell observed the gang member leave the apartment and get into a maroon Tahoe. The gang member's wife got into a green Civic. The vehicles followed each other northbound. When backup arrived, a felony stop was conducted in front of the SOB. The gang member was arrested on 8 misdemeanor warrants and Aggravated Kidnapping and Robbery felony warrants. Detective Stocking booked him into jail.

May 20: Agency UPD/Taylorsville

- Detective Afatasi responded to a request from Taylorsville patrol to help debrief a female suspect that had been arrested driving a stolen vehicle. Detective Afatasi helped gain information regarding another stolen vehicle that was recovered by Taylorsville and some other drug information that will be passed on to UPD as it is not gang related.

May 26: Fugitive Arrest

- Detective Bushnell observed that a suspect had a \$25,000.00 warrant for Child Abuse, 1st degree felony, Burglary, 3rd degree felony, and Riot, class 'A' misdemeanor. He then located the suspect's vehicle at his father's house in Taylorsville. The suspect was arrested and booked into jail after MGU conducted a knock and talk.

Investigations Unit

- On 4/1/15, Detective Ikemiyashiro was citing residents at 1540 W. Culpepper Cir with nuisance offenses. She encountered a wanted parole fugitive from California. He was arrested and booked into jail .
- On 4/1/15, Detective Ikemiyashiro observed suspicious activity at a business parking lot. She requested assistance from Detective Lloyd. As a traffic stop was initiated the vehicle attempted to flee. The occupants were taken into custody at gunpoint. Detectives located and seized 31 grams of methamphetamine, 1 gram of heroin, 33 grams of “bath salts” and scales. Detectives also determined that the vehicle was stolen.
- On 4/2/15, Detectives Morton and Miller arranged a heroin delivery in SLC. A traffic stop was attempted but the suspect fled. He was observed throwing baggies of heroin from the vehicle. Detectives were able to apprehend the subject. He consented to a search of his residence. Detectives located and seized 4 ounces of heroin, one ounce of methamphetamine, crack cocaine, pills, and \$1550 cash.
- On 4/2/15, Detectives Morton and Miller arranged to have methamphetamine delivered to the Taylorsville area. A traffic stop was conducted of the suspect’s vehicle. K9 alerted to the presence of drugs in the car. Detectives located and recovered two ounces of methamphetamine and ½ ounce of heroin.
- On 4/3/15, Detective Miller utilized evidence and information obtained through the investigation to obtain a search warrant for a residence and vehicle in Millcreek. Detectives located and seized 7 ounces of methamphetamine, 1.5 ounces of heroin, a .22 pistol, and evidence of large-scale drug distribution activity.

Investigations Unit

- On 4/7/15, Detective Ikemiyashiro conducted a traffic stop of a car leaving a suspected drug house. The driver handed her a counterfeit ID card. He exited the car and drugs were observed inside the driver's door. Search warrants were obtained for the car and the residence. Detectives located and seized 4 ½ ounces of heroin, 5 ounces of cocaine and over \$4300 cash. Three adults were booked into jail.
- On 4/7/15, Detective Miller arranged a drug delivery through a CI. The subject was contacted by officers and fled on foot and threw a quantity of heroin over a fence. A search warrant was obtained for the residence. Detectives located and seized five ounces of heroin, marijuana and paraphernalia.
- On 4/8/15, patrol officers observed a suspicious vehicle in a neighborhood. Two males were detained. Detective Miller obtained a search warrant for the car. Detectives located and seized 13 grams of heroin, 2 grams of methamphetamine and \$2388 cash.
- On 4/14/15, Detective Miller conducted a consent search at a residence in Taylorsville. A package had been delivered there containing 315 grams of "bath salts". A male arrived at the residence to retrieve the package and had an additional 3.5 grams of bath salts and \$12,229 in cash in his possession.
- On 4/14/15, Detective Ikemiyashiro observed a vehicle leave a suspected drug house. She conducted a traffic stop of the vehicle and obtained a search warrant for the car and the drug house. Detectives located and seized 20.8 grams of heroin, 10.8 grams of cocaine and \$5306 in cash. Two adult males were booked into jail.
- On 4/16/15, Taylorsville Investigations Unit detectives assisted Oquirrh detectives on a drug search warrant in Magna.
- On 4/17/15, Taylorsville Investigations Unit detectives assisted Oquirrh detectives on two drug search warrants, one in Kearns and one in Magna.

Investigations Unit

- On 4/22/15, Detective Bullock apprehended three students who stole a teacher's iPhone. Two of the students were compliant and one was combative and resisted arrest.
- On 4/24/15, Taylorsville Investigations Unit detectives assisted Oquirrh detectives on a counterfeiting case at the Extended Stay in Taylorsville. Detectives located and seized heroin, counterfeit documents, and counterfeit currency. Two adults were booked into jail.
- On 4/24/15, A joint investigation conducted by Taylorsville Investigations Unit, Detective Kresdon Bennett, and HSI resulted in the service of a search warrant in Taylorsville. Detectives located and seized 7.67 lbs of heroin, 3.07 lbs of methamphetamine, 2.08 lbs of cocaine, and \$12, 084 in cash.
- On 4/29/15, Taylorsville detectives assisted Sgt. Morton on the service of a search warrant at a storage unit in Millcreek. Detectives located and seized a stolen FBI sniper rifle, a pistol, methamphetamine, marijuana, and drug paraphernalia.
- On 4/30/15, Detective Miller obtained drug search warrants for two different residences. Detectives from Taylorsville, Oquirrh, and UPD Narcotics executed the search warrants. Detectives located and seized 13 lbs. of methamphetamine, 2 lbs. of heroin, 12.5 grams of cocaine, 2 vehicles, and \$35, 827 in cash.
- On 5/1/15, Sgt. Morton received information that a wanted fugitive gang member was at a residence in WVC. The fugitive was supposedly in possession of two handguns and ½ lb. of methamphetamine. Detective Fowler observed the fugitive at the residence and obtained a search warrant for the residence. Because of the fugitive's violent history and that he was armed, SWAT was called out to serve the warrant. The fugitive attempted to flee but was apprehended by members of the SWAT team. Detectives located and seized 7 ounces of methamphetamine, drug paraphernalia, and \$4587 in cash.

Investigations Unit

- On 5/2/15, Detective Miller received information that a suspect in a recent armed robbery was in possession of two firearms. Detectives located the suspect inside a car travelling through Taylorsville. A high hazard traffic stop was conducted and the suspect was arrested. Detective Miller obtained a search warrant for the vehicle. Detectives located and seized two firearms (one was stolen during a burglary), marijuana, and spice. The suspect was booked into jail.
- On 5/7/15, Detective Neal conducted a traffic stop of a suspicious vehicle. The driver was a wanted fugitive. He was in possession of stolen property including a credit card taken in a recent vehicle burglary. He was also found to be a gang member out of California.
- Several vehicles in the area of 4200 South to 4700 South and 1300 West to 2200 West were keyed or scratched by some type of metal object. Patrol officers were advised of this.
- On 5/12/15, Detective Miller received information that an individual would be delivering heroin to another party in Murray. Detective Miller observed a male matching the description of the suspect walking up to the area on foot. As detectives attempted to make contact, the male attempted to flee on foot. As Detective Miller and Sgt. Lex Bell attempted to subdue him, the suspect began reaching inside of his jacket. They were able to handcuff the suspect and located a loaded handgun inside of his jacket pocket where he had been reaching. Detective determined that the suspect was a documented gang member. Detectives located and seized one ounce of heroin. The subject was booked into jail.
