Report to the Controlled Substance Legislative Advisory Committee  
Utah Bureau of Forensic Services – Emerging Drugs  
September 2, 2015

It is recommended to the Controlled Substance Advisory Committee that the following **two** substances be considered for addition to the Utah Controlled Substances Act:

*These substances have been encountered multiple times at the Bureau of Forensic Services in casework samples since the current law was enacted in May 2014:*

- ADB-FUBINACA**      N-(1-amino-3,3-dimethyl-1-oxobutan-2-yl)-1-[(4-fluorophenyl)methyl]indazole-3-carboxamide
- AB-CHMINACA**    N-(1-amino-3-methyl-1-oxobutan-2-yl)-1-(cyclohexylmethyl)-1H-indazole-3-carboxamide

*For further information, the following substances have been encountered rarely at the Utah Bureau of Forensic Services in casework samples since the current law was enacted in May 2014 and do not seem to be emerging substances of concern at this time:*
