

Information from Taylorsville Engineering Department

Pedestrian Bridge at 4500 South



In efforts to improve regional connectivity and safety for pedestrians, Taylorsville is collaborating with Murray City, UTA, UDOT and the county to make this project possible. This safe sidewalk project extends and connects existing sidewalks to the Jordan River Trail. It also provides a bridge for pedestrians to safely cross the Jordan River at 4500 South. The ribbon cutting to celebrate completion of this project took place on Tuesday October 13, 2015 with Taylorsville and Murray officials in attendance.




2700 West Wall



A precast concrete wall will be constructed along the west side of 2700 West Road South of 4700 South. The project will replace the existing variety of fencing with a 6' stamped concrete sound wall (Taylorsville typical style). Completion of construction and staining of fence is scheduled to be completed in November 2015.

Four Taylorsville Gateway signs have been installed throughout the city at the follow locations:


- Taylorsville Expressway (4500 South)

6020 South Road Closure Gate



The automatic gate to at 6020 South is installed and scheduled to be operational next month, November 2015. This gate effectively closes 6020 South to through traffic while allowing emergency and service vehicles to pass through the area safely.

4700 South Casa Linda/ Del Taco Improvements



The construction to modify the drive access to the Casa Linda Apartments and Del Taco along 4700 South has been completed. Additionally, parking stalls have been constructed and landscaping has been restored for the remaining Casa Linda Apartment buildings. The roadway modification consolidates accesses along 4700 S and allows for all turn movements into and out of the Casa Linda apartments and Del Taco restaurant while paving the way for future BRT access.


HAM CRAM COURSE/AMATEUR LICENSE EXAM

The Flags of Honor will be displayed in front of City Hall on the grass again this year. Redwood Memorial Mortuary and Cemetery sets up this beautiful display. Each flag (40+) represents a Utah military person who has been killed in war. Along with the flag there is a tag attached with information about the person killed in war. It is a very moving experience to walk through the Flags of

Honor.

Additionally, we are having the Poster & Essay Contest for Taylorsville students, grades 1 through 8. The theme of the contest is "Combat Veterans." (Poster Contest – Grades 1-4, and the Essay Contest will be Grades 5-8).

On the October 7, 2015 City Council Meeting, UPD Taylorsville Precinct Chief Tracy Wyant presented a Team Citation Award to the Investigations Unit. From March 15, 2015 through September 15, 2015, a total of 803 cases were investigated by the Taylorsville Precinct Investigations Unit. These cases resulted in the following: 156 Arrests, 45 Pounds Methamphetamine, 44 Pounds Heroin, 15 Pounds Cocaine, 352 Grams Bath Salt, 22 Firearms, 7 Occupied Stolen Vehicles, \$254,107 U.S. Currency. Under the leadership of Lieutenant Mike Schoenfeld and Sergeant Vaughn Allen, the Investigations Unit continues its leadership in the law enforcement community in efficiency and results. Lt. Schoenfeld, Sgt. Allen, Sgt. Miller, Det. Bennett, Det. Lovendahl, Det. Fowler, Det. Bullock, Det. Vallencia, Det. Johnson, Det. Muniz, and Det. Neal.
