**DECLARING NOVEMBER 2015  
“NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH”  
IN OGDEN CITY**

- WHEREAS,** For millennia before Europeans settled in North America, the native people of this continent flourished. From generation to generation, they handed down invaluable cultural knowledge and rich traditions. Native Americans were the first to live in what is now Ogden; and
- WHEREAS,** Native Americans have significantly shaped our country's character and culture. They were the first stewards of our environment and helped to build the very fabric of America. Our cultural heritage has been enriched immeasurably by their customs and traditions, with each tribe sharing wonderful portions of its unique history and character; and
- WHEREAS,** Native Americans have also served this country with distinction, sharing their wealth of knowledge and talents. Many foods, medicines and remedies that are used today were introduced by them. Their many contributions continue to enrich and strengthen our community. They have made notable contributions in education, government, law, medicine, sports, art, the military, science and literature; and
- WHEREAS,** We cannot forget the long and unfortunate chapters of violence, discrimination, and deprivation Native Americans had to endure. For far too long, the heritage we honor today was disrespected and devalued. We cannot ignore these events or erase their consequences, but as we work together we can learn from the lessons of our past and forge a brighter future; and
- WHEREAS,** Today we honor the legacy of Natives and Native Americans and celebrate their rich heritage. Native American Heritage Month is a significant opportunity for our community to learn about Native American culture, and gain an awareness of the unique challenges Native people have faced and the ways in which they have worked to overcome and conquer these challenges.

**NOW, THEREFORE** the Ogden City Council and Mayor Michael P. Caldwell hereby proclaim November 2015:

**“Native American Heritage Month”**

in Ogden City. We recognize the profound influence and impact of Native Americans and acknowledge the importance of their contributions throughout the greater Ogden community.
