TONNAGE AND DIVERSION

Taylorsville residents helped to off-set costs with a total of **\$33,400** in savings & **\$2,293** in revenue for 21% waste diversion:


Revenue: \$2,293 in recycling revenue for 997 tons. (Price per ton decrease due to the recycling market)

Savings – Recycling: \$30,911 saved for diverting 997 tons of recycling from the landfill.


Savings – Green Waste: \$2,728 saved for diverting 180 tons to composting versus landfill.

Savings – Glass: \$360 saved for diverting 12 tons of glass from the landfill.

Diversion rate of 17%




Taylorsville Tonnages 3rd QTR 2015

YEAR TO DATE THROUGH SEPTEMBER COMPARISONS FOR TAYLORSVILLE AND DISTRICT-WIDE

Taylorsville residents represent the largest city in the service district with 16.6% of our households.

Residents of Taylorsville diverted 20% of waste away from the landfill from January through September.



Taylorsville residents have used 174 landfill vouchers with \$1,740 paid by the District for residential truck or trailer loads.



DISTRICT UPDATES & INFORMATION

- On September 2, 2015, District trucks began fueling Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) at the on-site station provided by Salt Lake County Fleet in partnership with Clean Cities.
- On November 3, Board Chair Dama Barbour and Vice Chair Jim Brass were present as Salt Lake County Mayor Ben McAdams addressed the media at the official opening of the County's CNG station. Using CNG instead of diesel fuel will save money and reduce carbon emission pollution. The District anticipates saving over \$200,000 in fuel costs in 2016 by using CNG versus Diesel. An additional \$15,000 will be saved by fueling on-site rather than traveling to and from other stations.
- There are now 414 green waste subscribers in Taylorsville with 2,840 subscribers District-wide.
- Our annual Customer Satisfaction Survey will be available on our website beginning November 23. All customers are invited to complete this survey to help us understand expectations and perceptions of our services.
- Christmas trees will be collected on the regularly scheduled collection days during the month of January. Trees must be free of all decorations and may be left next to your collection cans. For more details call our office at (385) 468-6325, or visit our website at: www.wasatchfrontwaste.org.
