

Health Requirements and Services: Communicable Diseases - FDAD

Reports

The Principal shall report to the local health authority or to the Utah Department of Health those students attending school who are suspected of having a reportable disease or condition, as defined by state law and the Utah Department of Health.

Exclusion

The Principal, at the direction of local health officers, an official of the State Department of Health, or the county attorney, shall exclude from attendance any student suffering from a reportable disease, as defined by the Utah Department of Health, until directed by the same officials.

Re-Admittance

Students excluded for reason of communicable disease shall be readmitted as determined by the local or state health authority or county attorney.

Communicable Disease Report

The following diseases are to be reported in writing to the Utah Department of Health or to the local health department. Those diseases followed by an asterisk (*) must be reported by telephone immediately upon discovery, as well as in writing. ~~Those diseases followed by two asterisks (**) should only be reported as numbers of cases occurring. No individual case information need be reported for them.~~ Otherwise, ~~e~~Each report should include the name of the student afflicted, age, sex, address, date of onset, and such other information as prescribed by the State Department of Health. If available, the report form supplied by the Department of Health should be used.
