

We are an umbrella organization that primarily works to:


- Raise awareness and bring attention to the river

Total number of trail-side volunteer hours logged	11,727
Total value of donated labor and supplies	\$324,713
Total Number of in-river cleanups	32
Total number of in-river volunteer hours	1,266
Total number of native trees and shrubs planted	1,258
Total pounds of native grass seed disbursed	800
Total pounds of invasive weeds removed	100,412
Total pounds of trash removed	3,500








