Resolution No. 16-08

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TAYLORSVILLE ADOPTING THE ONE-YEAR ACTION PLAN FOR THE FORTY-SECOND YEAR OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDING AND HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP FUNDING (2016-2017), AND APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF TAYLORSVILLE AND THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, the Taylorsville City Council (the "Council") met in regular session on March 16, 2016, to consider, among other things, a resolution of the City of Taylorsville adopting the one-year action plan for the forty-second year of community development block grant funding and home investment partnership funding (2016-2017), and approving an interlocal cooperation agreement between the City of Taylorsville and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Taylorsville is entitled under 24 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 91, *et al.*, to receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds in the amount of Three Hundred Fifty-eight Thousand Five Hundred Fifty-Eight Dollars (\$358,558) and HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) funds in the amount up to Eighty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the program year 2016-2017; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the people of Taylorsville that the City file an application with HUD for said funds in accordance with 24 CFR Part 91; and

WHEREAS, the public notices, hearings and other pre-submission requirements as set forth in 24 CFR Part 91 have been accomplished by the City, including but not limited to the following: a public hearing held Wednesday, March 2, 2016 to consider the proposed list of CDBG and HOME projects requesting funding and to obtain citizen opinions and views regarding the City's one-year action plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Taylorsville City Council as follows:

1. That the City of Taylorsville hereby adopts its final one-year action plan for CDBG and HOME as set forth in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference;

2. That the Mayor, as the official representative of the City of Taylorsville, is hereby authorized to submit the City's final one-year action plan for CDBG and HOME funds together with additional information and certifications as may be required under 24 CFR Part 91 to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

3. That the Mayor, as the official representative of the City of Taylorsville, is hereby authorized to sign and execute the HUD grant agreement and any and all subsequent agreements between the City and other public entities resulting from and consistent with the HUD grant

agreement, subject to final approval as to form by the City Attorney.
