The meeting was called to order by Mr. Prince. Those in attendance: David Noah, Robert Prince, Carol Pratt, Jody Smith, Dailene Anderson, and Kari Mitchell. Minutes read; changes made and accepted.

Mr. Noah will take the \$1500 out of another budget for the P. E. equipment.

Carol Nielson said that the document camera is saving her 10-15 minutes because the children can see and making a world of difference in teaching.

We want to challenge advanced kids; all kids.

Legislative updates: Mr. Noah said the legislature is trying to make many cuts. Including the State Board of education. Proposed that SEDC be cut. They give inservice to the teachers. They provided 3 whiteboards at no cost to the school.

Went over the different HB and SB on the handout.

This year we were 1 million dollars in the hole. Capital outlay allowed us to work that out.

A lot of teachers have 25 years or more and will be retiring in the next few years.

The title I school Report Card 2010-2011 school Year was sent home. Our numbers went down drastically. Bottom line we can do better. Teachers have been challenged to do better. Teachers looked at data and created goals in Math and Language Arts. Every child needs to be challenged. Those on grade level will not be tested as often as those below grade level. All students need to make progress. We eventually won't make AYP, but every child can show progress.

For Title I Parent-School Learning Compact needs to be approved by this council. The school is evaluated if a child moves out of state or out of country and that new school does not contact the school, that child is considered a "drop out."

Mr. Smith said that he has had parents talk to him about DIBBLES. Some of them aren't happy because they received letters saying that their children aren't on grade level. Mr. Noah said that the letter was a requirement to go home--a state mandated letter.
