Summary Recommendation:

This item is informational and therefore, no action is requested. The intent of this item is to provide the City Council, County Council, and the public a consolidated overview of Park City and Summit County's transportation program and associated funding discussions that have occurred before both council's over the last several months.

Executive Summary:

Park City and the surrounding area have experienced considerable growth in residential development, commercial development, and destination and day visitor travel. As a result, Park City's entry corridors and local streets can operate at capacity during peak times, which includes weekday peak travel times as well as peak ski weekends and special events. In order to adequately address transportation issues and work towards the City Council's goal to reduce dependency on the private automobile, substantial investments in programming and infrastructure will be required over the next 20 years which will include local, state, and federal funding. As such, transportation issues and associated solutions have been identified by the Park City, City Council, and the Summit County, County Council as "Critical Priorities." Addressing these issues on a regional scale and in a collaborative manner is essential to maintaining and enhancing the economic vitality of the region as well as the overall quality of life for the residents of Park City and Summit County.

Over the last several months, both Park City and Summit County Transportation Planning staff have presented several informational reports to their respective Councils on progress toward achieving local and regional transportation goals including preliminary recommendations from forthcoming planning studies. Initial reports focused on programmatic and contractual updates, while more recent reports have been focused on transitioning from scoping and planning phases to implementation with a more recent focus on specific projects, services and programs, and associated funding (existing and potential).
