History

- Utah County Solid Waste Special Service District was established on December 17, 1976 for the purpose of providing garbage and solid waste disposal services and facilities for the benefit of its Governmental Units.
- In 2002, because of legislative mandate, the name of the District was changed to North Pointe Solid Waste Special Service District. Most folks still affectionately refer to us as the “DUMP!”

- The landfill located in Lindon was opened in the mid 1950's and operated serving the garbage and solid waste needs of the Area until March of 1993 when it was officially closed and garbage was shipped by rail to ECDC Landfill in Carbon County.
- In January of 2006, we started shipping garbage by truck to Wasatch Regional Landfill located off I-80 at Exit 77, Rowley Road, in Tooele County.

Service Areas

- We serve the communities of American Fork, Cedar Hills, Highland, Lehi, Lindon, Orem, Pleasant Grove, Saratoga Springs, and Vineyard. We also serve the unincorporated areas of the County.

The Crew

- We have a staff of 15 full time, 1 part time and 2 temporary members that everyday do their best to provide a pleasant and safe environment for our customers to dispose of the waste.


- Annually, we ship in excess of 200,000 tons of waste to landfills located in Tooele and Utah Counties.
- Over the last 10 years North Pointe has shipped in excess of 1.6 million tons of MSW to landfills for disposal.



2015 Revenue



PERCENTATE OF TRANSACTIONS



- Over 73% of the MSW customers we serve are the general public. Our focus is to take care of the solid waste needs of the communities and businesses in our District while providing what we call “Essential Services” to our friends and neighbors.

- Each year we serve in excess of 100,000 customers. This translates into approximately 330 customers per day, or roughly 30 customers per hour. It isn't uncommon on a Saturday to serve 500 to 600 customers in a 9 hour day or approximately 65 customers per hour.


